In accordance with Commission Order No. 972-B issued on August 6, 1958, Graridge Corporation as Unit Operator respectfully request administrative approval to convert the following wells to water injection wells:

The following data pertinent to the proposed expansion are presented as support for the above request:

Each proposed injection well is directly offset by a producing well which has shown response to the water flood project.
(See attached Form Cll6 and Exhibit No. 1)

(2) Exhibit No. 2 indicates present injection well data. It is evident that some of the injection wells are not as receptive to water injection as others therefore, it is desirable to place wells on injection soon after waterflood response is noted in order to maintain flood balance.

(3) Exhibit No. 3 gives performance curves for the overall waterflood project.

(4) Three (3) of the subject wells, Nos. 6-10, 6-14, and 6-16 have been conditioned for water injection. Workover is now being done on the remaining one (1) proposed injection well. This operation should be complete or near completion at the time that administrative approval proceedings have been completed.
