ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701, Union Oil Company of California has made application to the Commission on March 2, 1962, for permission to expand its South Caprock Queen Unit Water Flood Project in the Caprock-Queen Pool, Chaves County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 27th day of March, 1962, the Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701.
4. That the proposed injection wells are eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Rule 701.
5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Union Oil Company of California, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Queen formation through the following described wells for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

Unit Well No. 3-8 located in the NE/4 NW/4
of Section 8,
Unit Well No. 7-8 located in the SW/4 NE/4
of Section 8,
Unit Well No. 15-8 located in the SW/4 SE/4
of Section 8,
Unit Well No. 3-17 located in the NE/4 NW/4
of Section 17,
Unit Well No. 5-17 located in the SW/4 NW/4 of
Section 17,
Unit Well No. 13-17 located in the SW/4 SW/4 of
Section 17,
Unit Well No. 8-19 located in the SE/4 NE/4 of
Section 19,
all in Township 15 South, Range 30 East, NMPM.
