ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-1533, Chaco Oil Company, has made application to the Commission on April 18, 1962, for permission to expand its Chaco-Red Mountain Water Flood Project in the Red Mountain Oil Pool, McKinley County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 8th day of May, 1962, the Secretary-Director finds:

- 1. That application has been filed in due form.
- That the proposed injection wells are eligible for drilling 2. under the terms of Order No. R-1533.
- 3. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- 4. That Wells I-2 and I-3 authorized as injection wells by Order No. R-1533 have proven productive of oil.
 - 5. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Chaco Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Mesaverde formation through the following described wells for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

Well No. I-14 located 80 feet from the South line and 2575 feet from the East line and Well No. I-15 located 560 feet from the South line and 2470 feet from the East line, both in Section 20, Township 20 North, Range 9 West, NMPM.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That Wells No. I-2 and I-3 have proven productive of oil and shall be replaced in the injection pattern by Wells No. I-14 and I-15 and will be redisignated as producing wells.

Done at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on the day and year hereinabove designated.
