ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701, General American Oil Company of Texas has made application to the Commission on April 1, 1968, for permission to expand its High Lonesome Water Flood Project in the High Lonesome Pool, Eddy County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 16th day of April, 1968, the Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701.
4. That the proposed injection wells are eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Rule 701.
5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, General American Oil Company of Texas, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Queen formation through the following described wells for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

Bosworth No. 2 located in Unit J of Section 14, Brewer No. 7 located in Unit E of Section 13, Brewer No. 10 located in Unit F of Section 13, and Brewer No. 16 located in Unit L of Section 14, all in Township 16 South, Range 29 East, NMPM.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall inject water through tubing with packers set as close to open hole as practicable in the above-described wells.

DONE at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on the day and year hereinabove designated.
