ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-3550, Champlin Petroleum Company has made application to the Commission on October 1, 1969, for permission to expand its Chaveroo Lauck Water Flood Project in the Chaveroo-San Andres Pool, Roosevelt County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 16th day of October, 1969, the Secretary-Director finds:

- 1. That application has been filed in due form.
- 2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
- 3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701.
- 4. That the proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Rule 701.
- 5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
 - 6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Champlin Petroleum Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the San Andres formation through the following-described well for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

Lauck-Federal Well No. 10 located in Unit L of

Section 29, Township 7 South, Range 33 East, NMPM.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall inject water through tubing with a packer set at approximately 4160 feet in said well.
