As per your request dated April 30, 2001, and for the reasons outlined in your letter, a one-year extension in which to convert to injection the West Red Lake Unit Wells No. 1, 3, 9, 12, 29, 37, 43, 45, 49, 61, and 78, approved by Division Order No. WFX-747, is hereby granted.

The injection authority for these wells shall expire on January 19, 2002 if the operator has not commenced injection operations.

Please be advised that no further extensions of Order No. WFX-747 will be granted. Should Devon or a successor operator wish to implement waterflood operations after January 19, 2002, it will be necessary to appear before a Division examiner to renew this waterflood permit.
