ORDER NO. SWD-112

THE APPLICATION OF WILSON OIL  
COMPANY FOR A SALT WATER DISPOSAL WELL.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701 (C) Wilson Oil Company, made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on April 1, 1970, for permission to complete for salt water disposal its Shell-State B-1399 Well No. 14 located in Unit L of Section 7, Township 21 South, Range 35 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

The Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 701 (C) of the Commission Rules and Regulations.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators, surface owners, and the New Mexico State Engineer Office have been duly notified; and
3. That the applicant has presented satisfactory evidence that all requirements prescribed in Rule 701 (C) will be met.
4. That there are no offsetting operators in this instance, therefore, the waiting period prescribed by said rule may be dispensed with.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:


That the applicant herein, Wilson Oil Company, is hereby authorized to complete its Shell-State B 1399 Well No. 14 located in Unit L of Section 7, Township 21 South, Range 35 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the injection of salt water for disposal purposes into the Yates-Seven Rivers formations at approximately 3695 feet to approximately 3843 feet through tubing with a packer set at approximately 3695 feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order after notice and hearing, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted in the interest of conservation. That applicant shall submit monthly reports of the disposal operation in accordance with Rules 704 and 1120 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.
