Gentlemen:

Administrative Order PC-75, as amended, authorized commingling of production from the Fusselman, Tubb/Drinkard, Devonian, Ellenburger, McKee, and Waddell zones on the Elwyn C. Hale - Hale State well Nos. 1, 2 and 3 in the S/2 NE/4 Section 2, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, Lea County.

It is respectfully requested that Order PC-75 be amended to authorize commingling of production from these wells as follows:

- Hale State No. 1: Fusselman and Tubb/Drinkard zones, no change.
- Hale State No. 2: Blinebry and Tubb/Drinkard zones.
(Dual completion order MC-1491, approved 5/25/64)
- Hale State No. 3: Blinebry, Ellenburger, McKee and Montoya zones.
(Quadruple completion order MC-1492, approved 5/25/64)

The metering and testing facilities for the production from Hale State No. 2 are those previously approved for Fusselman and Devonian zones.

The facilities for metering and testing production from the Blinebry and Montoya zones of Hale State No. 3 are those previously approved for Devonian and Waddell zones.

There has been no change in the lease equipment as originally approved.

Reference is made to your letter of June 22, 1964, requesting an amendment to Administrative Order PC-75, which as amended authorizes the commingling of Fusselman, Tubb-Drinkard, Devonian, Ellenburger, McKee, and Waddell production on Elwyn C. Hale's Hale State Lease comprising the S/2 NE/4 of Section 2, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico. It is our understanding that you wish to substitute the Blinbry and Montoya formations for the Devonian and Waddell formations in the above-described commingling authority.

Reference is made to your letter of September 9, 1964, with which you enclosed a photostatic copy of letter from Commissioner of Public Lands for the State of New Mexico dated October 31, 1962, authorizing Elwyn C. Hale to commingle the production from all zones then producing on his Hale State Lease in the S/2 NE/4 of Section 2, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico. This letter was in reply to our letter of August 19, 1964, suggesting that you contact the Commissioner of Public Lands obtaining his consent to the requested inclusion of the Blinberry and Montoya formations in the commingling installation in lieu of the Devonian and Waddell formations.

Gentlemen:

Under date of October 31, 1962 permission was granted to commingle the production from the Fusselman, Devonian, Drinkard, Waddel, McKee and Ellenburger zones, North Justis Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, from the captioned lease.

We hereby make application to delete the Waddel zone and add the Blinebry and Montoya zones. In support of this request we state that:

1. All production is from State lease B-2317 with no division of royalty interest.
2. The Blinebry and Montoya zones produce sweet crude with gravities of 36.0 to 43.5 and will result in no loss of revenue to the State of New Mexico.
3. No change has been made in the originally approved metering and testing installation by which all oil is metered before commingling.
4. There has been no production from the Waddel zone to date and none is anticipated in the future.

This application is respectfully submitted for your approval with the understanding that all oil produced and commingled will be in accordance with all the applicable Rules and Regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission.
