Dear Sir:

Sun Oil Company is in the process of completing its J. A. Akens #7 in the Oil Center-Blinebry Pool. We are currently producing oil from the Eunice Pool on this same lease. We respectfully request an exception to Rule 303(a) to permit commingling in common facilities of the commonlyowned production from these two sources of supply. We understand that our proposed facilities -- as shown by the enclosed schematic diagram -are in accord with the applicable provisions of the Commission's current "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities."

The gravity of the oil produced from the Eunice Pool is 28° API having a value of \$2.63 per barrel and being produced at the rate of approximately 13 BPD into the facility to be commingled. The Oil Center-Blinebry production has an oil gravity of 42° API at a value of \$2.87 per barrel and we expect to produce 84 BPD. Enclosed are a schematic diagram of the proposed installation and a plat showing the location of all wells on the subject lease and the pool from which each well is producing. The actual commercial value of such commingled production will not be less than the sum of the values of the production from each common source of supply.

Your consideration in this matter will be appreciated.


