Reference is made to your application dated November 19, 1963, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of Blinebry and Tubb-Drinkard production on your Langlie "B" Federal Lease comprising the S/2 NE/4 of Section 11, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, Justis Field, Lea County, New Mexico, after separately metering the Tubb-Drinkard production and determining the Blinebry production by means of the subtraction method.

Provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," including the requirement for a non-reset counter on the meter, and provided further, that you shall notify the Hobbs District Office of the Commission at such time as this installation is complete in order that a field inspection may be made of the installation prior to putting it in operation.
