Dear Sir:

Reference is made to Administrative Order PC-214 as amended by letter dated February 16, 1965, wherein administrative approval was granted permitting the commingling of Blinebry, Brunson, Drinkard, and Hare Simpson production on Marathon's L. G. Warlick "C" lease located in Section 15, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

In that L. G. Warlick "C", Well No. 3 was made a top allowable Drinkard well following remedial work the production from this well was separately metered and the remaining production was allocated on the basis of periodic well tests. Since Well No. 3 has declined to its present productivity of approximately 25 BOPD Marathon respectively requests permission to discontinue metering this production and return to the original provisions of Administrative Order PC-214 wherein all production is allocated on the basis of periodic well tests.
