Sinclair Cil & Gas Company requests an exception to Statewide Rule 303 to permit commingling of oil produced from the Drinkard and Elinebry Oil Pools on the S. J. Sarkeys lease in the SE/4 of Sec. 23 - T 21 S - R 37 E, Lea County, New Mexico. The Sarkeys lease currently has permission to commingle without separate measurement, the distillate production from the Tubb Gas Pool, the distillate production from the Blinebry Gas Pool, the oil production from the Wantz Abo Pool and the oil production from the Drinkard Pool. The Blinebry Gas well (No. 1) is being recompleted as a Blinebry Cil - Drinkard oil-oil dual. The Wantz Abo well (No. 3) is to be recompleted as a Blinebry Cil - Drinkard oil-oil dual. The Blinebry is expected to produce top allowable and the Drinkard is expected to produce top allowable from one well and marginal from the others.

It is requested that administrative approval be granted to commingle the oil from the Blinebry Cil Fool with the oil from the Drinkard Pool by metering the Blinebry Cil and using the subtraction method to determine the oil production from the Drinkard Pool. It is proposed to use a separate facility for the distillate from the Tubb Gas zone. The individual well production from each Pool is proposed to be apportioned by periodic well tests as required by the Commission. Well tests are to be accomplished by shutting in all other wells while testing another.

The gravity of the Blinebry oil is 39° API and is valued at \$2.99 per barrel. The Drinkard oil is 41° AFI gravity and is valued at \$3.01 per barrel. The gravity of the crude mixture will be 39.6° API since the Drinkard will produce only 33% of the total production. The resulting price of the mixture will be \$2.99 per barrel.

An early approval of this application would be appreciated. Upon approval of this application please cancel the previous commingling order which is Case No. 2247, Order No. R-1945.




