Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated August 31, 1964, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of North Abo, Wolfcamp, and Upper Fennsylvanian production on your Texaco-Mobil "State" Lease, comprising the S/2 NE/4 of Section 25, Township 17 South, Range 34 Mast, Vacuum Field, Lea County, New Mexico, after separately metering the North Abo and Wolfcamp production and determining the Upper Fennsylvanian production by means of the subtraction method.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools on said lease in the above-described manner. Provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," and provided further, that you shall notify the Hobbs District Office of the Commission at such time as the installation is complete in order that an inspection may be made of the installation prior to putting it in operation.

Gentlemen:

In accordance with New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Rule 303 (b) TEXACO Inc. hereby makes application for administrative approval of and exception to Rule 303 (a) to permit commingling operations to be conducted on the TEXACO Inc., TEXACO-Mobil "State" Lease, Vacuum (North Abo, Wolfcamp and Upper Pennsylvanian) Pools, Lea County, New Mexico. In support of which the following is stated:

- 1. TEXACO Inc. is the operator of the TEXACO-Mobil "State" Lease, consisting of 80 acres, being the SE/4 and SW/4 of the NE/4 of Section 25, Township 17 South, Range 34 East, Lea County, Mew Mexico. Attached is a plat showing the location of all wells on this lease and the pools from which they are producing.
- 2. The TEXACO-Mobil "State" Lease has one triple completion well that produces from the North Abo, Wolfcamp, and Upper Pennsylvanian Pools. One well, Mobil "Bridges" Well No. 14, produces from the San Andres Pool and is not, in any respect, a part of the TEXACO-Mobil "State" Lease. Production from this well shall be maintaned separate and in no way involved with the proposed commingling. The TEXACO-Mobil "State" Lease was formed by joint operating agreement between Mobil Oil Company and TEXACO Inc. in order to accomplish optimum 80-acre dedication for the North Abo, Wolfcamp and Upper Pennsylvanian Pools to TEXACO-Mobil "State" Well No. 1.
- 3. The expected daily liquid hydrocarbon production from the North Abo Pool is 49 barrels of 39.7° API gravity oil at \$2.99 per barrel, that from

the Wolfcamp Pool is 70 barrels of 38.90 AFI at \$2.97 per barrel, and that that from the Upper Pennsylvanian Pool is 247 parrels of 40.7° API at \$3.01 per barrel. The combined daily production after commingling is expected to be 366 barrels of 40.3° API gravity liquid hydrocarbon at \$3.01 per barrel, resulting in a \$3.78 per day gain in revenue. The production from zones to be commingled is considered as being intermediate sweet.

- 4. (Common Ownership Subtraction Nethod) In accordance with Item II, Section 2-3 of the current "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities", it is proposed to meter prior to commingling all but one zone. The proposed zone not to be metered is the Upper Pennsylvanian zone which produces the highest gravity crude. Positive displacement type meters with samplers and non-reset counters will be installed on the Morth Abo and Wolfcamp zones for accurate measurement prior to commingling. A schematic diagram of the proposed commingling is attached, and is in substantial compliance with the aforesaid manual.
- 5. Terms of the joint operating agreement provide for 50 percent of all production be allocated to TEXACO Inc. and 50 percent to Mobil Oil Company. The State of New Mexico owns the royalty interest in the total acreage dedicated to the pertinent producing well. A copy of this application is being sent to the New Mexico Commissioner of Public Lands.
- 6. Texas-New Mexico Dipe Line Company shall be crude purchaser from the subject lease and a copy of this application is being sent to them at ".). Box 1510, Hidland, Texas.

In view of the facts recited in this application, it is respectfully recuested that administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) be granted TEXACO Inc. to permit commingling into a common tank battery production from the Vacuum (North Abo, Molfcamp, and Upger Pernsylvanian) Pools on the TEXACO-Wobil "State" Lease.




