Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated April 7, 1965, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of distillate produced from the Basin Dakota and Blanco-Mesaverde Gas Pools on your Culpepper-Martin Lease comprising the S/2 of Section 6, Township 31 North, Range 12 West, San Juan County, New Mexico, allocating the production on the basis of periodic well tests. It is our understanding that the average production from the Dakota is ten barrels per day and from the Blanco-Mesaverde five barrels per day. Further, that the ownership of both zones is identical throughout.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the condensate production from the aforesaid pools on said lease in the above-described manner. Provided, however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities."
