Dear Sir:

We hereby submit application to co-mingle condensate from the Dakota and oil from the Tocito Gallup formations in accordance with Rules 303-A and 303-B, New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission.

The Dakota zone produces 26 barrels of condensate/MMCF; the Tocito zone produces 47 barrels of 44 gravity oil per day. We propose to allocate production back to each zone according to oil meter on Tocito Gallup and to gas-oil ratio tests taken each six months on Dakota and reported on Form C-115. Production from both zones is commonly owned.

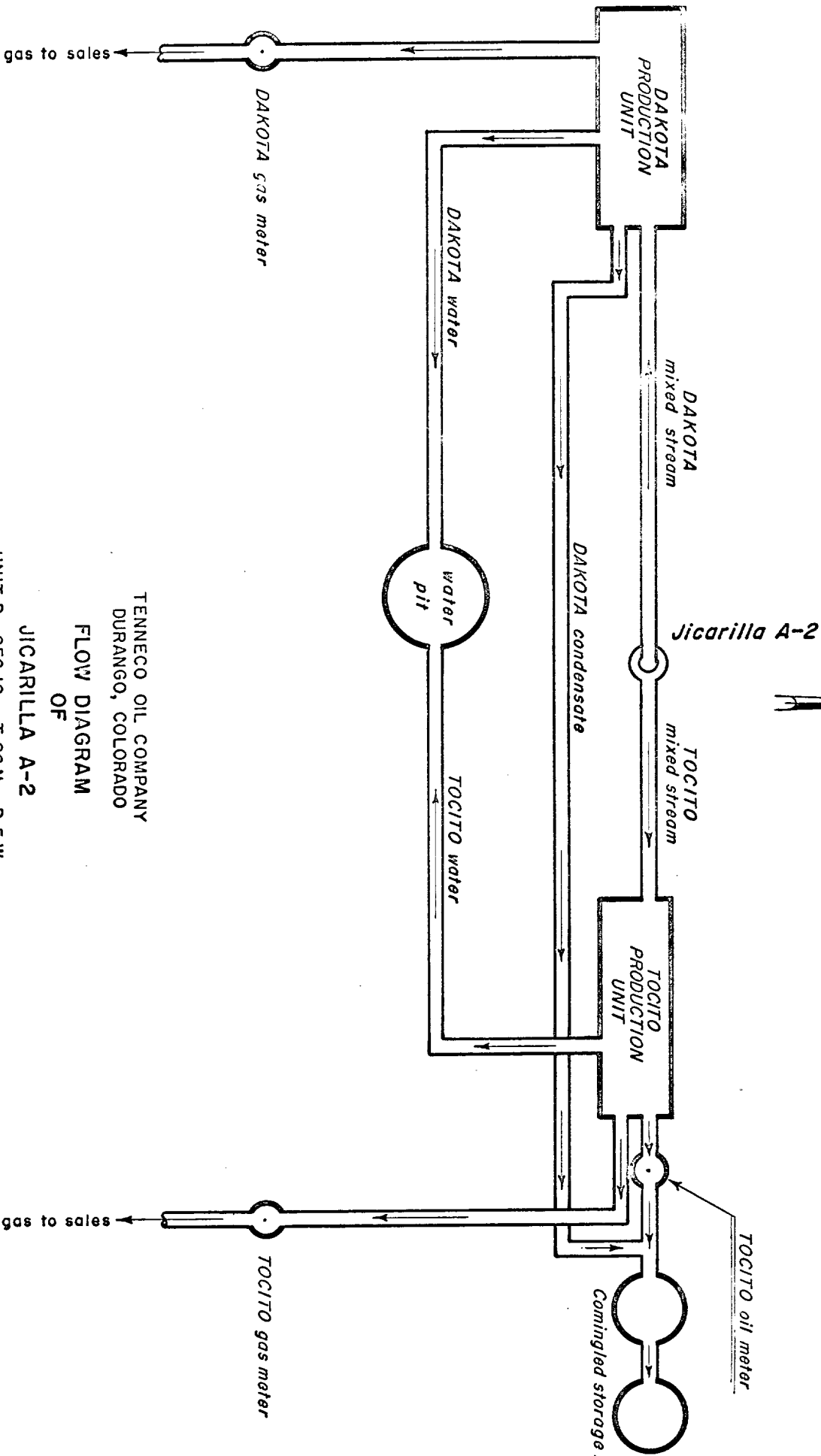
Attached is a sketch outlining the hook-up of our production equipment. Gallup zone is marginal and Dakota liquids are also marginal.
