



Amendment, dated May 3, 1966, to Administrative Order PLC-13 provides for the commingling of production from the Howse "A" and "B", Bilberry, Cone "A" and "B", State "U" Leases into the Cone Central Storage System. Pools commingled are the House Drinkard and House San Andres Oil Pools.

Subsequent to the above date, the Bilberry Lease (Well No. 1) has been plugged and abandoned.

The Howse "C" Well No. 1, located 1980' FNL x 660' FEL Section 11, T-20-S, R-38-E, Lea County, New Mexico, Undesignated - Abo Oil Pool, has been completed as a marginal well and is currently producing at the rate of approximately 11.8 barrels per day.

This is a request that Administrative Order PLC-13 be revised, eliminating the Bilberry Lease and permit the inclusion and the commingling of the Howse "C" Lease production into the Cone Central Storage System.

A schematic drawing of the Central Storage System, located in Unit F, Section 12, T-20-S, R-37-E, and a plat depicting the leases and wells involved are attached.

Production from the Howse "C" Lease will be separately measured and sampled, and the installation shall be in accordance with the 'Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities." 


