Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated July 28, 1969, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) and Rule 309-A of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of Blinebry, Grayburg-San Andres, and Drinkard production from your Bowers Federal "A" Lease and Blinebry and Grayburg-San Andres production from your Bowers Federal "A" Com 33 and Drinkard production from your Bowers Federal "A" Com 31 after separately metering the production from each lease and each pool.

Pursuant to the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) and Rule 309-B of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools and leases in the above-described manner. Provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," including the requirement for samplers and non-reset counters on the meters. Please notify the Hobbs District Office of the Commission at such time as this installation is complete in order that an inspection may be made thereof.

It is the responsibility of the producer to notify the transporter of this commingling authority.

Dear Mr. Porter:

This letter supersedes our letter of July 17, 1969, as discussed with Mr. D. S. Nutter on July 25, 1969. Since that letter was written a top allowable Hobbs Drinkard well has been completed on the subject lease and additional commingling approvals are desired.

Humble Oil & Refining Company requests administrative approval to commingle all Hobbs Grayburg-San Andres, Hobbs Blinebry and Hobbs Drinkard production from the contiguous portions of Humble's Bowers "A" Federal and Bowers "B" Federal Leases, comprising the SE/4 of Section 30 and the W/4 of Section 29, T-18-S, R-38-E, Lea County, New Mexico (see attached plat).

The production is anticipated to be from seven completions each in the Hobbs Grayburg-San Andres and Hobbs Blinebry and two probable Hobbs Drinkard completions on the Bowers "A" Federal Lease plus one completion in each pool from a portion of the Bowers "A" Federal Lease communitized with the contiguous 20 acres of the Bowers "B" Federal Lease. Experience to date indicates that all nineteen completions will be top allowable. The attached plat shows seven present San Andres completions and four present Blinebry completions on the Bowers "A" Federal Lease. An additional Blinebry well, Bowers "A" Federal 31, is being completed and two Blinebry-Drinkard duals are staked for the Bowers "A" Federal Lease. Also being completed is a Hobbs Drinkard well, Bowers "A" Federal Com 31, which has already been tested above top allowable with a low ratio. (Note that the Hobbs Blinebry side of this dual is not communitized) The Drinkard proration units and allowable are pending a favorable ruling on Amerada's Case No. 4173 heard by the Commission on July 23, 1969. Humble is now drilling a proposed Blinebry-San Andres dual completion, Bowers "A" Federal Com 33. The Hobbs Grayburg-San Andres completion in Well 33 will replace Bowers "B" Federal 1 which is incapable and will be abandoned.

Since the royalty interests in the two Federal leases are different, Humble proposed to separately meter the production from each pool from the Bowers "A" Federal lease and from each pool from the communitized acreage. This will result in six separate metering facilities, each conforming with New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Rules 303 and 309 and the "Manual for Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities" dated September 13, 1961. A schematic drawing of the proposed facilities is attached. After separate measurement the production would then be produced through common treating facilities into the commingled Bowers "A" Federal tank battery in Unit J of Section 30 for storage and sale through ACT (approved by NMOCC Permit Nos. 1 364-365).

There will be no monetary loss due to the proposed commingling. Average May sales gravities were 35.8° API for the San Andres and 37.9° API for the Blinbry. July allowables were 438 barrels per day for the seven San Andres wells and 332 barrels per day for the four Blinbry completions. The Drinkard oil tested 36.5° API. The gravity of the commingled product will be in the 36° API range; the transporter, Shell Pipeline Company, classifies all as sour production and presently takes all into a common line. The posted prices applicable are 35° API - \$3.04/barrel, 36° API - \$3.06, and 37° API - \$3.08. The approval of this application will result in a considerable saving to both Humble and the transporter in the construction and operation of production handling facilities.

A letter of approval from the United States Geological Survey covering only the commingling of the Hobbs Grayburg-San Andres and Hobbs Blinbry production from the Bowers "A" Federal lease is attached. In the interest of time, a letter covering the additional requests has been sent to the U.S.G.S. asking that their approval be sent directly to you. Your early approval of these requests will be appreciated since it will eliminate the construction of unnecessary facilities.

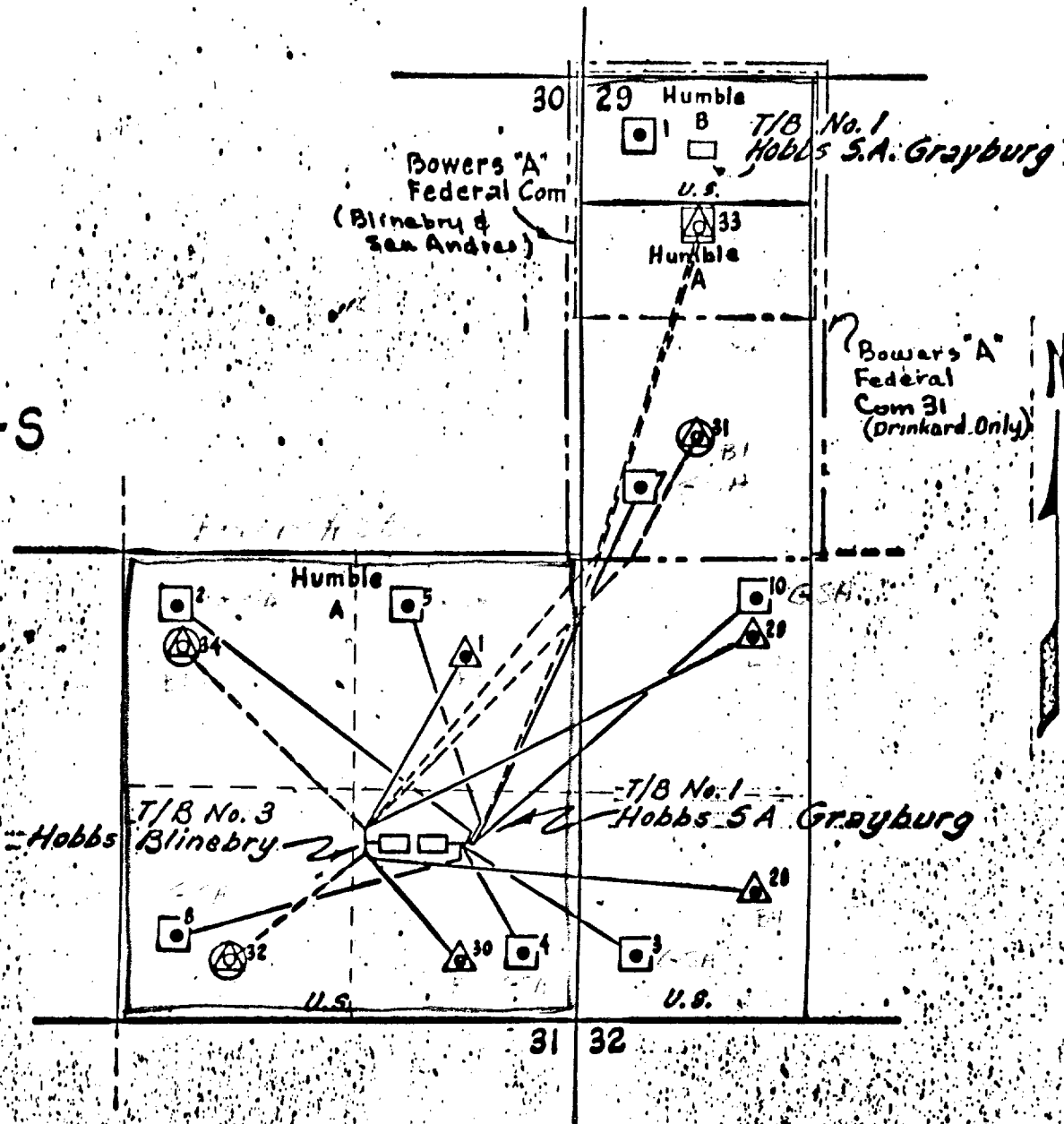
Attachments: Schematic of proposed commingled tank battery.

Your letters of July 17 and 25 request approval to modify the commingling system approved by our letter of July 14, 1969, lease Las Cruces 032233(a). You now propose to add Drinkard production from wells on lease Las Cruces 032233(a), communitized Grayburg-San Andres and Blinbry production from well No. 33, and communitized Drinkard production from well No. 31 to presently commingled Grayburg-San Andres and Blinbry production.
