Dear Mr. Chumbley:

Reference is made to the following: (i) your application (*application reference No. pKRV0-204350619*) submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division") on February 12, 2002; (ii) your telephone conversation with Mr. Michael E. Stogner, Engineer in Santa Fe on Wednesday, February 13, 2002; and (iii) the Division's records in Santa Fe: all concerning Premier Oil and Gas, Inc.'s ("Premier") request for an unorthodox infill oil well location within an existing standard 40-acre oil spacing and proration unit comprising the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 15, Township 17 South, Range 30 East, NMPM, Loco Hills-Paddock Pool (96718), Eddy County, New Mexico.

This 40-acre unit is currently dedicated to Premier's Dale H. Parke "C" Well No. 13 (**API No. 30-015-31074**) located at a standard oil well location 360 feet from the South line and 990 feet from the East line of Section 15.

This application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rule 104.F, revised by Division Order No. R-11231, issued by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission in Case No. 12119 on August 12, 1999.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Division Rule 104.F (2), the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox infill oil well location within the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 15 is hereby approved:

**Dale H. Parke "C" Federal Well No. 11  
1070' FSL & 330' FEL  
(API No. 30-015-31076).**

Further, both the existing Dale H. Parke "C" Well No. 13 and the proposed Dale H. Parke "C" Federal Well No. 11 are to be simultaneously dedicated to the subject 40-acre unit.
