Gentlemen:

Texas Pacific Coal and Oil Company respectfully requests approval under the provisions of Rule 5 (B) and 5 (C) of General Rules and Regulations for Southeastern New Mexico in Order No. R-1670 for the formation of two 160 acre non-standard gas proration units for its State "A" A/c-2 Well #8 and Well #12, both wells being located in Section 7, Township 22 South, Range 36 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

NSP 614  
State "A" A/c-2 Well #8 is located 660' from the south and east lines of said section and was recently completed in the Yates formation as a gas well in the Jalmat Gas Pool. The proposed 160 acre non-standard gas proration unit for this well will consist of the S/2 S/2 of Section 7.

NSP 615  
State "A" A/c-2 Well #12 is located 1980' from the south line and 660' from the east line of said section and has been producing gas from the Yates formation in the Jalmat Gas Pool since February, 1953, on a 320 acre non-standard gas proration unit consisting of the S/2 of Section 7. The proposed 160 acre non-standard gas proration unit for this well will consist of the N/2 S/2 of said section.

As the standard gas proration unit in the Jalmat Gas Pool is 640 acres, State "A" A/c-2 Well #8 and Well #12 meet the maximum acreage requirements as set forth in Rule 5 (B).

Also in support of this request, the following requirements of Rule 5 (C) are conformed to for the non-standard gas proration units:

1. The said units consist of less acreage than a standard unit.
2. The said units consist of contiguous quarter-quarter sections.
3. The said units lie within a single governmental section.
4. The said units may reasonably be presumed productive of gas.
5. The length or width of the said units does not exceed 5280'.
6. Copies of this application have been sent to the other operator in the section and to all operators owning interests within 1500' of the subject wells.

A plat is attached hereto showing to the best of our knowledge and belief the proposed units, the location of the wells and the offset ownership.

In view of the facts set out herein, it is respectfully requested that the Commission grant administrative approval of the non-standard gas proration units for Texas Pacific Coal and Oil Company's State "A" A/c-2 Well #8 and #12.


