

APPLICATION

MYCO Industries, Inc., ("MYCO") through its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application pursuant to the provisions of N.M.Stat.Ann. § 70-2-17, (1978), for an order pooling all mineral interests in all formations from the surface to the base of the Morrow formation in the following described spacing and proration units located in the W/2 of Section 31, Township 21 South, Range 28 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico: the W/2 for all formations and/or pools developed on 320-acre spacing which includes but is not necessarily limited to the East Carlsbad-Morrow Gas Pool, Undesignated West Indian Flats-Atoka Gas Pool, Undesignated Tansill Dam-Atoka Gas Pool, East Carlsbad-Strawn Pool, Undesignated East Carlsbad-Wolfcamp Gas Pool; the SW/4 for all formations and/or pools developed on 160-acre spacing; and the NW4 SW/4 for all formations and/or pools developed on 40-acre spacing; and in support of its application states:

1. MYCO is a working interest owner in the W/2 of said Section 31 and has the right to drill thereon.
2. MYCO proposes to dedicate the above-referenced spacing or proration units to its Juneau "31" Fee Com Well No. 1 to be drilled at a standard gas well location 1980 feet from the South line and 660 feet from the West line (Unit L) of said Section 31, to a depth sufficient to test any and all formations from the surface to the base of the Morrow formation.
3. MYCO has sought and been unable to obtain a voluntary agreement for the development of these lands from certain interest owners in the subject spacing units who are identified on Exhibit A to this application.

4. Said pooling of interests will avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, will prevent waste and will protect correlative rights.

5. In order to permit MYCO to obtain its just and fair share of the oil and gas underlying the subject lands, all mineral interests should be pooled, and MYCO Industries, Inc. should be designated the operator of the well to be drilled.

WHEREFORE, MYCO Industries, Inc. requests that this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on May 22, 2003 and, after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division enter its order:

- A. pooling all mineral interests in the subject spacing and proration units,
- B. designating MYCO Industries, Inc. operator of these units and the well to be drilled thereon,
- C. authorizing MYCO Industries, Inc. to recover its costs of drilling, equipping and completing the well,
- D. approving the actual operating charges and costs of supervision while drilling and after completion, together with a provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS accounting procedures, and
- E. imposing a penalty for the risk assumed by MYCO Industries, Inc. in drilling and completing the well against any working interest owner who does not voluntarily participate in the drilling of the well.


Ladies and Gentlemen:
