## **MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE**

David H. Arrington Oil and Gas, Inc., ("Arrington"), through its counsel, moves the Division enter its order continuing the July 8, 2004 hearing on the Application in this matter to the July 22, 2004 examiner hearing docket. As grounds for this motion, Arrington states:

Arrington is the owner of certain oil and gas leasehold working interests located within the boundaries of the proposed 3,200-acre Boddington Federal Exploratory Unit that is the subject of the Application in this matter.

Arrington is attempting to evaluate the unit proposal, but has not been provided with sufficient information to determine whether it supports or opposes the Application. Other than an AFE for the initial well and a brief letter requesting its participation in a differently configured unit (Exhibit A, attached), no substantive information has been provided by the Applicant to Arrington for evaluation. Further, Applicant initially welcomed, but then subsequently dis-invited Arrington from attending the recent "area and depth" presentation at the BLM Carlsbad field office where the basis for the creation of the proposed unit was discussed in connection with the BLM's reasonableness determination. As a consequence, Arrington cannot at this time assess its position.

A continuance to the July 22, 2004 docket will allow for discussions between the parties to occur and may facilitate ultimate approval of the proposed unit. No prejudice will accrue to any party from a two-week continuance.

We attempted to obtain concurrence with this motion, but were unable to communicate with Applicant's counsel.

WHEREFORE, David H. Arrington Oil and Gas, Inc. requests this matter be continued to the July 22, 2004 examiner hearing docket.
