WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 9:15 a.m.:

CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: That concludes the items on the docket, with one exception. Yates Petroleum has filed an application -- well, it's actually a motion in Cause Number 13,153, the Motion of Yates Petroleum Corporation for a stay of Commission Order Number R-12,108-A and for an emergency order.

At this time I would recommend for the Commissioners that we go into executive session to discuss the Yates motion. Is there any objection to that?

COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: No, I just wanted to clarify, was this a motion for a stay or a motion for rehearing? Is there a difference there? I may be hung up on the terminology, but does the re-hearing also include within it a stay? Is this what this is about?

MR. BROOKS: There were separate motions filed.

There was a motion for re-hearing filed, and there's a

motion for stay. Now, I'm unclear, actually, on what

exactly actions have gone on. I was on vacation when all
this occurred.

The docket states that the Commission will discuss the Application of Yates Petroleum Corporation for re-hearing, Application of Pride Energy for cancellation of a drilling permit and reinstatement, an emergency order

1	halting the operations and compulsory pooling. That's just
2	the style of the original Application.
3	However, subsequent to the time when the docket
4	was made up, Yates filed a motion of Yates Petroleum
5	Corporation for a stay of Commission Order Number R-12,108
6	and for emergency order. That was filed on October the
7	12th. The motion for re-hearing was filed on September the
8	29th.
9	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Right, the Commission needs to
10	discuss both that motion and the Application for re-hearing
11	filed by Yates, and I believe Pride's response to that
12	motion for re-hearing, to the Application for re-hearing.
13	MR. BROOKS: Right.
14	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Does that answer your
15	question, Commissioner Chavez?
16	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Yes, it does.
17	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Do I hear a motion to go into
18	executive session to discuss these related motions and
19	Applications?
20	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I so move.
21	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I second.
22	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: All those in favor?
23	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.
24	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Aye.
25	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The motion carries.

1	At this time the Commission will go into
2	executive session to discuss the motion of Yates Petroleum
3	Corporation for a stay, the Application for re-hearing and
4	the response to the Application for re-hearing. Thank you.
5	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Okay. Florene, are you
6	there?
7	MS. DAVIDSON: Yes.
8	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Well, on my all I have
9	is a copy of the Application for re-hearing. I don't have
10	a appear to have a copy of the document of Brian's reply
11	or, if I need to, the Motion for Stay.
12	MS. DAVIDSON: Okay, I faxed them, and I thought
13	they went through, but I'll re-fax them.
14	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Oh, okay, when it you faxed
15	them?
16	MS. DAVIDSON: The dates they came in, yesterday
17	for the response, and I guess it was the 12th for the
18	motion.
19	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Okay.
20	MS. DAVIDSON: But I'll re-fax them.
21	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Well, I may have those
22	popping up recently. Let me take a look, and I'll have
23	Monica give you a call or something
24	MS. DAVIDSON: Okay.
25	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: if I don't have those,

1	because she usually receives the faxes by now.
2	MS. DAVIDSON: Okay.
3	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I can check very, very
4	quickly, on the fax, just a second.
5	MS. DAVIDSON: Okay.
6	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: See if I have that. About
7	what time of day would this be faxed, the response?
8	MS. DAVIDSON: It would have been late yesterday
9	for the response. The motion itself, I'm not sure what
10	time of day it was.
11	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Morning.
12	MS. DAVIDSON: Morning, okay.
13	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Okay, I'm sorry, no, I
14	don't have any faxes for yesterday afternoon.
15	MS. DAVIDSON: Okay, I'll re-fax it.
16	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Thank you.
17	MS. DAVIDSON: Uh-huh.
18	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Frank, at this time why don't
19	we just take about a five-minute break and allow Florene to
20	fax that to you?
21	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Okay, do you want me to
22	just leave the phone on, or call me back?
23	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Nah, we'll leave it on.
24	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Okay.
25	(Off the record at 9:20 a.m.)

(The following proceedings had at 10:23 a.m.) 1 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Let the record reflect that 2 the Commission came out of executive session at 10:23. We 3 4 are going to take a one-hour-and-seven-minute break and reconvene at 11:30. 5 (Off the record at 10:23 a.m.) 6 7 (The following proceedings had at 11:39 a.m.) CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Let the record reflect it is 8 9 At this time we will go back on the record with respect to Cause Number 13,153. 10 The Commission has met in executive session and 11 12 made a decision. We've instructed Mr. Brooks to draft an 13 order. Mr. Brooks has drafted that order, and we are in 14 the process of sending a fax copy to the Aztec Office for 15 Mr. Chavez to be able to look at, and as soon as that's 16 done, we will look at it here. 17 Mr. Brooks, would you like to -- without a copy 18 of it in front of you? 19 MR. BROOKS: Well, since I just wrote it just a 20 few minutes ago, I think I can discuss it without a copy in 21 front of me. 22 Basically, the Order does what the Commission 23 indicated was their pleasure in the matter, which is that 24 the Motion for re-hearing in the case will be granted but 25 will be limited to the issue of the costs for which

reimbursement will be allowed to Yates.

I attempted to make clear in the order that this would be not just the reasonableness of the amounts of costs but the period of time during which those costs will be incurred, will be reconsidered. And in all other respects -- Well, the motion for re-hearing is granted, but a re-hearing will be limited to that issue, because that issue does not affect -- and also the correction of clerical errors in the order, of which one was discovered.

Since that issue does not affect the right to operation of the subject well, the order provides that the emergency Motion for stay by Yates will be overruled.

CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Commissioner Chavez, do you have any questions?

me. This is considered a ruling on a motion?

MR. BROOKS: Yes.

COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Okay. So that sounds right, yeah, that's what I agree with.

MR. BROOKS: I contemplate -- Based on the way the Statute is worded, I contemplate that when the matter is finally determined -- this being the -B Order; the original Order was 12,108, then the Commission's Order was 12,108-A, and this will be 12,108-B, and then when the matter is finalized, I contemplate that we will enter Order

Number 12,108-C, which will include all the provisions of 1 Order Number 12,108-A, will be a republication of Order 2 Number 12,108-A with only those provisions changed which 3 will be changed by the determination made at the hearing. 4 5 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: That's very good, I don't 6 have any problem with that. MR. BROOKS: Okay, that appears to me to be what 7 the Statute contemplates, and then if they take it to 8 District Court they can challenge any provision of the 9 10 Order. 11 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Frank, would you let us know 12 when the fax gets there? 13 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Okay. It hasn't shown up 14 yet, but... 15 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: David, how will we handle 16 the -- assuming that the Order, you know, is okay with each 17 of the Commissioners, how will we handle getting it signed by Frank? Can we --18 MR. BROOKS: I don't believe that's actually 19 20 essential. I think it -- we have a quorum of the 21 Commission present, and we can have two Commissioners sign it. We could, however, send the original to Frank and have 22 23 him sign it. 24 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I'm supposed to be there --25 MR. BROOKS: Yeah, you're supposed to sign it at

1	the time of the during the Commission Hearing, though.
2	I think it would probably be best just to have those
3	Commissioners who are present sign the order, and
4	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Well, the record will show
5	that I agree to it.
6	MR. BROOKS: Right.
7	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: So I don't think that's a
8	problem.
9	MR. BROOKS: I think that's acceptable.
10	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Commissioner Bailey, did you
11	have any thoughts on what's been said so far?
12	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: No, I think that that is
13	the sense of our agreement.
14	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: The fax hasn't showed up
15	yet, but we're still waiting here.
16	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: I hope she's not having
17	problems upstairs.
18	(Off the record)
19	MR. BROOKS: Maybe I should go and check on
20	because that could be done now. Let me go and check and
21	see what's where we are.
22	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Okay, here it is.
23	MR. BROOKS: Oh, okay, good, we've got it. Now,
24	the only problem is, we don't have it, but I assume Florene
25	is on her way back down. Here she is.

CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: You assume correct. And from 1 the look on her face, it doesn't look like it was a good 2 deal. 3 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I'm reading through it 5 right now. Looks good to me. Does that look okay to you, 6 Frank? 7 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Yes, but it says limited to 8 the determination under the Order portion, the second part, 9 of -- limited determination and costs for which Yates 10 should be allowed reimbursement. 11 Do you want to limit that to that time period? 12 13 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Well, that's what --COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Otherwise, for the whole 14 15 period, including the future... MR. BROOKS: Okay, let's see what is the point 16 17 that is being raised here. 18 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I think the point was only for the expenses incurred during the first efforts to re-19 enter the well. Otherwise, it seems to open up all other 20 costs in the future associated. 21 MR. BROOKS: Well, I would -- I think that's 22 I don't think the intent was to allow Yates to incur 23 additional expenses. I think that -- I don't think that 24 25 it's likely to be subject to that interpretation, simply

1	because Yates is not appointed operator under the
2	agreement, so there's no particular reason to assume they
3	would be incurring any other expenses for which
4	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Okay, I see.
5	MR. BROOKS: they would be allowed
6	reimbursement.
7	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Yeah, you're exactly right,
8	okay. That looks good, then, I'm in agreement.
9	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay, at this time let the
10	record reflect that Commissioner Chavez is in agreement but
11	that Commissioner Chavez is not present to sign the Order.
12	Therefore, the two Commissioners who are present will sign
13	the Order.
14	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I intend to.
15	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Is there any other business
16	before the Commission today?
17	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: None for me.
18	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: No.
19	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. The Chair would
20	entertain a motion to adjourn.
21	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I move we adjourn.
22	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Second.
23	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: It's been moved and seconded.
24	All those in favor?
25	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.

1	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Aye.
2	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Opposed?
3	The October meeting of the New Mexico Oil
4	Conservation Commission is adjourned at 11:59 a.m.
5	MR. BROOKS: 11:49.
6	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: 11:49 a.m., thank you. We're
7	hereby adjourned. Thank you.
8	(Thereupon, these proceedings were concluded at
9	11:49 a.m.)
