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Page 2 1 CHAIRWOMAN BAILEY: It's 9 o'clock. This is 2 the first meeting of the Oil Conservation Commission 3 Meeting for 2011. I am Jami Bailey, Director of the Oil Conservation Division. To my left is Bob Balch, who is 4 5 the department secretary. To his left is Commission 6 Counsel Cheryl Bada, and to her left is Lisa, the court 7 reporter. To my right is Scott Dawson, designee from the New Mexico State Land Office, and to his right is 8 Florence Davidson, the Commission secretary. 9 The first item of business -- oh, well, we have a 10 11 full commission, and we are meeting here in Porter Hall 12 at 9 o'clock in the Wendell Chino Building here in 13 Santa Fe. Now, the first item on our docket is approval of 14 the minutes of the December 9th, 2010 Commission meeting 15 and the December 20th, 2010 Special Commission meeting. 16 17 I am the sole surviving member of that Commission, and I have reviewed these minutes. So on behalf of that 18 19 Commission, I will sign these minutes. The next item of business is election of the 20 chairman of the Oil Conservation Commission. Do I hear 21 22 any nominations? 23 I nominate Jami Bailey. MR. BALCH: 24 MR. DAWSON: Second. 25 CHAIRWOMAN BAILEY: All those in favor, aye.

Page 3 1 MR. DAWSON: Aye. 2 MR. BALCH: Aye. 3 CHAIRWOMAN BAILEY: All those opposed? And 4 I accept the chairmanship of the Oil Conservation 5 Commission. Thank you very much. And I will always ask the indulgence of the 6 7 attorneys who are representing their clients to help me along the lines of the rules for a hearing since I'm not 8 9 an attorney. 10 The third item will be adoption of the annual resolution setting forth reasonable notice standards for 11 12 Commission Public Meetings pursuant to the New Mexico 13 Open Meetings Act. 14 Cheryl, would you please tell us what this resolution means, what it is? 15 16 MS. BADA: What the resolution is, is it establishes your requirements for notice of your 17 18 meetings, regular meetings and emergency meetings. You're required to do that by the Open Meetings Act each 19 year. So it sets out where you're going to publish the 20 notice, how much notice you have to give, when the 21 agenda will be available, both draft and final. 22 And it 23 also addresses who can attend the actual meeting and then also addresses -- I lost my train of thought on the 24 25 But it essentially sets those items out; last item.

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Page 4 1 what you can do as far as notice and what you think is adequate notice for those meetings. 2 CHAIRWOMAN BAILEY: Are there any questions 3 concerning resolution, any discussion? 4 5 MR. BALCH: No questions. MR. DAWSON: 6 No. 7 CHAIRWOMAN BAILEY: Then all those in favor of adopting the resolution establishing procedures for 8 9 giving notice of public meetings of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission, please signify by saying aye. 10 11 MR. BALCH: Aye. 12 MR. DAWSON: Aye. 13 CHAIRWOMAN BAILEY: All those opposed? Seeing none, the resolution is adopted and will be 14 signed by each of the Commissioners. 15 We'll now call the first case on the docket, case 16 17 (12276, which is Application of Burlington Resources Oil 18 & Gas for compulsory pooling in Section 36, Township 27 North, Range 8 West in San Juan County, New Mexico. 19 This case will be dismissed. 20 The next case, 12277, Application of Burlington 21 Resources Oil & Gas Company for compulsory pooling in 22 Section 16, Township 31 North, Range 11 West, San Juan 23 24 County, New Mexico. This case is also dismissed. 25 I'll call together the next two cases:

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Page 5 Case 14472, which is the Application of COG Operating, 1 LLC for cancellation of the Operator's Authority and 2 Termination of Spacing Units, Yeso Energy, Inc., Dow "B" 3 28 Federal Well Number 1 in Eddy County, New Mexico, and 4 case 14547, which is Application of the New Mexico Oil 5 Conservation Division. The applicant seeks an order 6 7 authorizing the Oil Conservation Division to recognize an operator of record for wells currently operated by 8 9 Yeso Energy, Inc., OGRID 0221710. These two cases will be continued until tomorrow morning at 9 AM here in 10 Porter Hall. 11

12 The next cases on the docket case 14558, which is 13 Application of Marbob Energy Corporation for vertical 14 expansion of the Burch Keely Unit, Eddy County, 15 New Mexico. This case will be continued to the 16 July 27th, 2011 commission meeting.

17 Case 14577, Application of COG Operating LLC for 18 vertical extension of the Grayburg-Jackson (Seven 19 Rivers-Queen-Grayburg-San Andres) to correspond with the 20 Unitized Formation of the Burch-Keely Unit in Eddy 21 County, New Mexico. This case will also be continued to 22 July 28th, 2011.

Case 14497, which is the Application of David H.
Arrington Oil & Gas, Inc. for compulsory pooling, Lea
County, New Mexico will also be continued to July 28th,

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1 2011. And finally, case 14538, which is Application of 2 Marshall & Winston, Inc. to cancel an operator's 3 authority and terminate a spacing unit and approve a 4 change of operator, Lea County, New Mexico will also be 5 continued to July 28th, 2011. 6 So we are left for this session with the two 7 8 cases that will be heard tomorrow morning here in this 9 room at 9 AM. 10 Are there any other matters before the Commission today? Do I hear a motion to continue this hearing 11 until tomorrow morning? 12 MR. DAWSON: I'll motion. 13 14 MR. BALCH: Second. 15 CHAIRWOMAN BAILEY: All those in favor, aye? 16 MR. BALCH: Aye. 17 MR.
