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Page 2 (9:06 a.m.) 1 The next order of 2 CHAIRPERSON BAILEY: business is signing of the order for Case Number 14966, 3 which was the de novo application of Cimarex Energy 4 Company for a nonstandard oil spacing and proration unit 5 and compulsory pooling in Chaves County, New Mexico. 6 Counsel Brancard, would you like to explain 7 the order? 8 9 Thank you, Madam Chair. MR. BRANCARD: 10 The order is a little lengthy because we're having to implement all the conditions that normally go 11 12 with a spacing and proration unit here. 13 But, basically, the Division denied this 14 initial application for two reasons, essentially that 15 the geology showed that there was a nonproductive area within the unit which would impair the correlative 16 rights of interest owners in the rest of the unit and 17 that, under a prior Division order, the Division had 18 decided that units that exceeded 160 acres for 40-acre 19 units should only be granted in unusual cases. And the 20 21 order outlines the evidence presented by Cimarex that shows to the Commission's satisfaction that all the 22 23 units -- all the 40-acre units within the larger unit are productive, and, therefore, there is no problem with 24 correlative rights any longer. 25
