APACHE CORPORATION'S RESPONSE TO COG OPERATING, LLC'S THIRD MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE

For its response to the Motion for Continuance filed by COG Operating, LLC, ("COG"), applicant Apache Corporation ("Apache") states as follows:

- 1. Apache filed its application with the Oil Conservation Division seeking an order approving its proposed Thunderbird Resource Development Unit on October 30, 2017. The proposed unit consists of approximately 3,198.44 acres of federal and state lands situated in Township 16 South, Range 30 Sections 32: E/2, 33, 34, 35 and 636: S/2 and Township 17 South, Range 30 East, Section 4 in Eddy County, New Mexico.
- 2. On November 16, 2017 COG entered an appearance in the case. On November 20, 2017 COG requested that the case be continued to the Division's December 11, 2017 docket.
- 3. On December 15, 2017 COG sought a second continuance of the case based upon its contention that it had scheduled a meeting with the BLM for January 4, 2018 to discuss the location for wells it was proposing to drill on its acreage adjacent to the unit, which would obviate any opposition it had to the boundaries of the unit.
- 4. Apache agreed to consent to the continuance on the condition that the case would be set for hearing in January on a date that was convenient to Apache. Apache subsequently notified COG that the January 11, 2018 docket was more convenient and the case was set to be heard on that date.

5. The Division has previously denied operators more than two requests to continue a case and COG has failed to establish why it needs more time to prepare for hearing since its motion states that it was meeting with the BLM on January 5, 2018 and it has adequate time to determine whether it will oppose Apache's Application.

6. Apache has been working on this unit for almost two years and has received approval from the BLM and State Land Office for the unit. Apache first provided notice to COG of its proposed unit on July 17, 2017 and COG has had almost 6 months to evaluate the unit and its development plans. *See* July 17, 2017 e-mail from Laci Stretcher to Adam Reker, attached as Exhibit "A."

7. Apache has already permitted wells within the proposed unit and has plans to begin development that will be prejudiced by further delay. Additionally, because COG previously agreed to the date for the hearing, Apache has made plans for attendance; if the case is heard on January 25, 2018 Apache's travel costs will be substantially increased.
