Page 2 (9:02 a.m.) 1 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: The next item is Case 2 Number 15957, which is the application of the New Mexico 3 Oil Conservation Division to amend rules of the 4 5 Commission concerning the drilling, spacing, and operation of horizontal wells and related matters by 6 7 amending various sections of Rules 19.15.2, 19.15.4, 19.15.14, 19.15.15, and 19.15.16 NMAC; statewide. 8 9 Obviously, we heard this case in April and deliberated on it, and the instructions were to counsel 10 11 for the Commission to draft the changes to the rules 12 based on our deliberations and to prepare the order. 13 Mr. Brancard, would you please address that? 14 So the Commissioners 15 MR. BRANCARD: Sure. 16 should have received the -- what I hope is the final version of the rules based on the changes that the 17 18 Commission made during deliberations. So I guess the 19 first order of business would be if the Commission has 20 any other comments or ideas about the rules, or are you comfortable with the version that you received? 21 22 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Do you have any 23 comments, Bob? 24 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Well, I read it 25 quickly on my phone, so it might not be a bad idea to

Page 3 take a long look at it on my computer, but --1 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Okay. Are you saying 2 this morning? 3 4 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Yeah. 5 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Okay. COMMISSIONER BALCH: I don't know if 6 7 anybody else has any comments on it. 8 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Ed, did you get a chance 9 to look through it? 10 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: I looked at it, and I 11 have no changes. 12 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: I have perhaps one, if 13 we could take a moment here. 14 (Pause in proceedings, 9:05 a.m. to 9:06 15 a.m.) 16 MR. BRANCARD: I would have sent that out about two weeks ago. 17 18 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Yeah. 19 Let me double-check something. I wanted to 20 look at that version --21 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Do you want to see the 22 written copy? 23 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I was fine with it up until now. I just wanted to make sure -- make sure --24 25 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: They were just

1 grammatical and punctuation.

2 MR. BRANCARD: Actually what I'm sort of directing the Commission to look at is the actual rules 3 themselves, if you have any comments or changes on that. 4 5 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Not on the rules, no. I just wanted to check the order again. 6 7 MR. BRANCARD: Is everybody fine with the 8 rules? 9 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: I'm good with it. 10 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: (Indicating.) 11 MR. BRANCARD: Okay. Then you can look at 12 the draft order that you have. 13 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Did you accept all the changes from Commissioner Chair? 14 MR. BRANCARD: Yes, I did. 15 16 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Yeah. 17 MR. BRANCARD: And just so you're aware, 18 the rules, we've already sent them to the State Records 19 administrator. So it's been reviewed by them, so it 20 should be in the correct format. So there wouldn't likely be -- this should be pretty absolutely close to 21 what will get filed. We have to put it exactly in their 22 23 format, but they're very helpful about reviewing 24 versions and telling us what to change, if necessary. 25 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Okay. So would you

Page 5 already know if there were any changes, or do you think 1 2 they've already done that review? 3 They've already done that MR. BRANCARD: review with this version I've sent you. This is in the 4 5 final -- it looks different from what you saw during the б hearing, but this is in the final filing version. 7 COMMISSIONER BALCH: They didn't have any 8 changes? 9 MR. BRANCARD: Oh, there were a few spacing, typo kind of changes. Nothing substantive. 10 11 COMMISSIONER BALCH: So nothing that would 12 require us to review it again? 13 MR. BRANCARD: No. And I think I caught a cross-reference --14 that was about it -- when I reviewed the final version. 15 16 Other than that, it's what you -- all the changes that you accepted during deliberation, which was sort of a 17 18 challenge in putting together the order because we had 19 many versions of amendments that you-all considered, and 20 I wanted to make sure it was clear that you-all went through all that and addressed a lot of these issues. 21 22 So if the Commission -- if you want to have 23 a motion to adopt the rules in final form to be filed 24 and then adopt the order. 25 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: I so move.

Page 6 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I will second. 1 2 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Okay. So moved. We 3 have approved these versions as submitted by Mr. Brancard for the rules and also we've adopted the 4 order of the Commission. 5 MR. BRANCARD: Okay. Just so you're aware 6 7 of what's going to happen next: This will take about a 8 month for all the various steps. First, under the Oil 9 and Gas Act, there is a 20-day period for somebody to ask for a rehearing, and we have to wait until that 10 11 runs. And if nobody asks for a rehearing, at that point we can file the rules with the State Records Center. 12 They don't become effective immediately. They become 13 effective when they get published in the "New Mexico 14 Register." So the earliest that can happen is June 15 16 26th. 17 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Refresh your memory. For rulemaking, if there is a request for rehearing, 18 19 does that come before all of us, or is it still a matter 20 for the Chair? 21 MR. BRANCARD: It's before all of you. 22 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Okay. 23 MR. BRANCARD: So, basically, when it comes 24 in, you'll have ten days to decide whether you want to 25 have a rehearing. And I think you may have a meeting --

1 I think the hearing on the --

2 COMMISSIONER BALCH: June 4th? 3 MR. BRANCARD: It may come in before the rehearing on the spill and release rule. But if not, 4 5 the Commission Chair can always call a special meeting for you-all to decide. If you take no action, it's 6 7 deemed denied after ten days. 8 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Did that happen last time this occurred? 9 MR. BRANCARD: There are several of these 10 11 where you let the ten days run. If we get a request for 12 a hearing, we'll send it out to you-all immediately. And if any one of you wants to have a special meeting, 13 you can call one. We can do it telephonically. You 14 could decide to, you know, without the rehearing 15 petition, schedule a new hearing or deny the hearing 16 petition. 17 18 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Is that considered a 19 closed hearing? Do we need to arrange for the court 20 reporter to have -- to decide if we're going to have a 21 phone hearing? 22 MR. BRANCARD: That would be an open 23 meeting. 24 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Have some organization 25 to it.

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Page 8 MR. BRANCARD: Usually a special meeting means three days. COMMISSIONER BALCH: Okay. I guess we'll wait and see. CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: We can go ahead and sign б the order. (Case Number 15957 concludes, 9:13 a.m.)
