This matter came on for hearing before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on Monday, August 20, 2018, at the New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, Wendell Chino Building, 1220 South St. Francis Drive, Porter Hall, Room 102, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

- 2 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Good morning, everyone.
- 3 Let's go ahead and get started. We're on a regular
- 4 meeting for the Oil Conservation Commission. This is
- 5 August 20th. I'm Heather Riley. I'm the Chair.
- If I could take roll, please.
- 7 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Robert Balch, designee
- 8 of the Secretary of Energy, Minerals and Natural
- 9 Resources.
- 10 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: Ed Martin for the
- 11 State Land Office.
- MR. BRANCARD: Bill Brancard, Commission
- 13 counsel.
- MS. DAVIDSON: Florene Davidson, Commission
- 15 clerk.
- 16 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: All right. Have you-all
- 17 had a chance to look at the agendas for today's
- 18 hearings?
- 19 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I have reviewed the
- 20 agenda and move to adopt it.
- 21 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: I've reviewed it and
- 22 second that.
- 23 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: So moved.
- 24 And then have you-all had a chance to
- 25 review the minutes of the July 19th through 20th

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1 meeting -- Commission meeting?
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- 2 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: I have reviewed it
- 3 and move to adopt it.
- 4 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I would second that
- 5 motion.
- 6 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: So moved.
- 7 (The proceedings conclude, 9:02 a.m.)
- 8 (9:39 a.m.)
- 9 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Item Number 6, the
- 10 Commission will determine whether and when to hear the
- 11 following cases: Case Number 16376, application of
- 12 New Mexico Oil Conservation Division to amend rules of
- 13 the Commission concerning the drilling, spacing and
- 14 operation of horizontal wells and related matters by
- 15 amending Section 15 of Rule 19.15.16 NMAC statewide.
- The second is Case Number 16377,
- 17 application of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division
- 18 to amend rules of the Commission for permitting of wells
- 19 for underground injection by amending certain sections
- of Rule 19.15.26 NMAC statewide.
- 21 So we need to look at potential dates for
- 22 setting these cases for hearing.
- I believe at the last hearing,
- 24 Mr. Brancard, you had some timelines that you had worked
- out for how to get this accomplished, and I think it

1 required that we had to move -- if we were going to do

- 2 it in October, we had to move the date one day. Does
- 3 that sound correct?
- 4 MR. BRANCARD: That's correct, Madam Chair.
- 5 I hate to ask the Commission to once again change the
- 6 dates of its meetings. But in order to meet the 30-day
- 7 deadline for public notice, we would have to have the
- 8 Commission hearing on October 11th rather than October
- 9 10th.
- 10 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I'm okay with that
- 11 date.
- 12 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: I'm okay.
- 13 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: I'm okay, again, as long
- 14 as someone brings birthday cake.
- 15 COMMISSIONER BALCH: It's your birthday?
- 16 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Yes.
- 17 But I would love to spend the day with
- 18 you-all in here.
- 19 COMMISSIONER BALCH: What's your favorite
- 20 cake?
- 21 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Something with
- 22 chocolate.
- 23 (Discussion off the record.)
- 24 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: So we'll move that to --
- October's hearing to October 11th.

1 MR. BRANCARD: So we have two applications

- 2 for rulemaking. One is a series of -- well, two
- 3 technical changes to the horizontal well rule. There
- 4 were some typos, misstatements that need to be
- 5 corrected, without getting into the substance of the
- 6 matter.
- 7 And the second was based on a review of the
- 8 injection rule that some -- there are a lot of issues
- 9 about the injection rule. We discovered that in this
- 10 last case, and -- but they're just looking at the scope
- of the rule, essentially. So that's what this proposal
- 12 is, just dealing with the scope of the rule. The
- 13 concern being that the Commission is considering a whole
- 14 series of different types of injection wells under this
- 15 rule, both the traditional produced water -- saltwater
- 16 disposal wells, EUR wells, the acid gas injection wells.
- 17 And this group, I believe, wanted to make sure that it
- 18 was clear the Commission had jurisdiction over all those
- 19 different kind of wells.
- 20 I will say it's my understanding that the
- 21 division is still looking at that language to see if
- 22 they can make it more clear. And, also, the other thing
- 23 that has to occur in dealing with the scope is to make
- 24 sure that there is no problem with how the EPA defines
- 25 the scope of a Class 2 well under its rules. So the

1 Commission's also reviewing some possible language on

- 2 that.
- 3 But the scope of this rulemaking is just on
- 4 that issue that's proposed to us, so we wouldn't -- any
- 5 changes to the application would not affect what you're
- 6 considering here in terms of the scope of the
- 7 rulemaking. So while we all may be tempted to get into
- 8 other issues under the injection rule, this one is
- 9 pretty narrow.
- 10 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Easily resolvable in a
- 11 couple of days probably?
- 12 MR. BRANCARD: Oh, this should all be done
- in a day, I think.
- 14 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: Yeah. It's very narrow.
- 15 MR. BRANCARD: Both of these hearings
- 16 together.
- 17 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Because I will not be
- 18 available until the next month if we go past Friday.
- 19 MR. BRANCARD: Yeah. I think this is all a
- 20 one-day.
- 21 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Okay.
- 22 MR. BRANCARD: So do we have a motion?
- 23 CHAIRWOMAN RILEY: It requires a motion?
- MR. BRANCARD: Yes.
- 25 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I would move we hear
