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- 3 EXAMINER JONES: Call Cases 20546 and
- 4 20547, applications of Matador Production Company for
- 5 compulsory pooling, Eddy County, New Mexico.

- 6 Call for appearances.
- 7 MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, Jim Bruce of
- 8 Santa Fe representing the Applicant. I'm presenting the
- 9 cases by affidavit.
- 10 EXAMINER JONES: Any other appearances?
- 11 MR. PADILLA: Ernest L. Padilla for EOG
- 12 Resources, Inc. And I have no witnesses or opposition
- 13 to this case.
- 14 EXAMINER JONES: It was EOG Resources?
- MR. PADILLA: Yes.
- MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, I've handed you
- 17 the package of exhibits.
- 18 Exhibit 1 is the affidavit of Sam Pryor, a
- 19 landman for Matador. He has previously testified before
- 20 the Division in these two cases. If you go back to the
- 21 attachments on Exhibit 1, you'll see there is -- they
- 22 are seeking to drill the Stebbins 19 Fed Com 203H well
- 23 in the north half-south half of Section 19 and then the
- 24 204H well in the south half-south half of Section 19,
- 25 both in 20 South, 29 East. It shows that the south half

1 is all one federal lease -- the south half-south half is

- 2 all one federal lease. The north half-south half of
- 3 Section 9 -- 19 is two federal leases.
- 4 It contains sheets showing the interest
- 5 owners who are being -- the uncommitted working interest
- 6 owners and uncommitted -- excuse me -- the uncommitted
- 7 working interest owners who are being force pooled. In
- 8 each case, they are pretty much the same people,
- 9 although their interests may vary somewhat.
- In addition, the overriding royalty
- 11 interest owners are being force pooled. That is shown
- 12 by the landman. They are identified. There are quite a
- 13 few of them. Probably about 40 overriding royalty
- interest owners are being force pooled.
- 15 Exhibit -- an attachment to the landman's
- 16 exhibits shows the proposal letter to the working
- 17 interest owners. It also contains the AFEs for the
- 18 wells. These are Wolfcamp wells, and each of the wells
- 19 is about -- oh, about \$7.7 million. These are stated to
- 20 be fair and reasonable prices. The locations will be
- 21 orthodox. There are no depth severances in the Wolfcamp
- 22 formation, and they have been in contact with each of
- 23 the interest owners seeking to be pooled. They're
- 24 asking for 7,000 a month for a drilling well and \$700 a
- 25 month for a producing well for the overhead rates, as

1 well as the maximum cost plus 200 percent penalty.

- 2 The affidavit also states that they
- 3 provided Holland & Hart, the original attorneys in this
- 4 case, with the names and addresses of the parties to be
- 5 pooled. And Exhibit 2 is a letter from Mr. Rankin of
- 6 Holland & Hart notifying all of these interest owners of
- 7 the pooling hearing. As you can see, they use one of
- 8 these online services, and it gives the status of the
- 9 certified mail. But they also published in the Hobbs
- 10 newspaper a notice identifying each and every one of the
- interest owners, so even if they hadn't received or had
- 12 not returned a green card by the time of this hearing,
- 13 they were all given notice. All of the interest owners
- 14 were given notice of the application constructively.
- 15 Exhibits 2 and 3 are for the 203H well,
- 16 which is the north half-south half Exhibits.
- 17 Exhibits 4 and 5 are the affidavit -- or
- 18 the notice letter and the Affidavit of Publication for
- 19 the 204H well, which is the south half-south half well.
- 20 And, again, all of the parties were notified either by
- 21 certified mail or by -- or constructively.
- 22 Exhibit 6 --
- 23 EXAMINER BROOKS: All the -- all the
- 24 interest owners that you want to say were notified
- 25 constructively were all listed in the advertisement?

1 MR. BRUCE: They have either received

- 2 certified mail, or they were constructively noticed by
- 3 the newspaper publication.
- 4 EXAMINER BROOKS: Yeah. But does the
- 5 affidavit cover whether or not they were -- they were --
- 6 do you have -- you have the notice attached to that,
- 7 right, the publication notice?
- 8 EXAMINER JONES: Yeah. It's right here.
- 9 EXAMINER BROOKS: Does it have all the
- 10 names on it?
- MR. BRUCE: Yes. Yeah. There's a bundle
- 12 of them. In legal terminology, there's a bundle of
- 13 names.
- 14 EXAMINER BROOKS: You don't have to read
- 15 them all.
- 16 EXAMINER JONES: I like that legal
- 17 terminology.
- 18 MR. BRUCE: But I did -- I did go through
- 19 it to verify that each and every person who is
- 20 identified as a working interest owner or an overriding
- 21 royalty interest owner was notified by publication.
- 22 EXAMINER BROOKS: Does the affidavit cover
- 23 due diligence in searching for the addresses?
- MR. BRUCE: Yes.
- 25 EXAMINER BROOKS: I'm glad. Thank you.

1 EXAMINER JONES: And the Coles [sic;

- 2 phonetic] are in there, too, John Cole.
- MR. BRUCE: Both of these wells are
- 4 Wolfcamp wells.
- 5 Exhibit 6 is the affidavit of Andy Juett,
- 6 the geologist. And he includes the locator map,
- 7 structure map of the Wolfcamp. And the structure dips
- 8 gently to the east or east-southeast, and a cross
- 9 section showing that these wells, both of them, are
- 10 going to the Wolfcamp Y zone, which is not quite the top
- of the Wolfcamp Formation. And the formation is pretty
- 12 much uniform in thickness across the length of the well
- 13 units, and there are no geologic impediments to drilling
- 14 horizontal wells in this area. And each quarter-quarter
- 15 section will contribute more or less equally to
- 16 production.
- 17 The geologist states that horizontal
- 18 drilling is the most efficient method to drill and
- 19 produce the Wolfcamp in this area, and then there are
- the wellbore cartoons, schematics, showing that the well
- 21 will satisfy the setbacks as required by the Division.
- 22 With that, I'd move the admission of
- 23 Exhibits 1 through 6.
- 24 EXAMINER JONES: Any objection?
- MR. PADILLA: No objection.

Page 8 EXAMINER JONES: Exhibits 1 through 6 are 1 2 admitted. 3 (Matador Production Company Exhibit Numbers 1 through 6 are offered and admitted into 4 5 evidence.) 6 EXAMINER JONES: It's interesting. It's 7 Eddy County, but it's not Purple Sage. MR. BRUCE: It's a little too far north. 8 9 EXAMINER JONES: A little too far north. 20 South is too far north. Okay. 10 11 EXAMINER BROOKS: I have no questions. 12 EXAMINER JONES: I guess that's it. 13 Cases 20546 and 20547 are taken under advisement. 14 15 (Case Numbers 20546 and 20547 concludes, 4:27 p.m.) 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25
