This matter came on for hearing before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, Leonard Lowe, Chief Examiner; Michael McMillan, Technical Examiner; and David K. Brooks, Legal Examiner, on Thursday, June 27, 2019, at the New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, Wendell Chino Building, 1220 South St. Francis Drive, Porter Hall, Room 102, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Page 3 (9:19 a.m.) 1 EXAMINER LOWE: We will call Case Numbers 2 20286, 20287, 20288, 20289 and 20290. 3 Call for appearances. 4 5 MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, Jim Bruce of Santa Fe representing the Applicant. 6 7 I am submitting these cases by affidavit. 8 There's a lot of commonality in these cases. I will start off with the first case, and the rest of it will 9 be pretty similar. 10 11 EXAMINER LOWE: Are there any other 12 appearances? 13 Proceed. MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, just a short 14 introduction. These cases all involve pooling of the 15 16 Townsite of Loving, New Mexico or, as I called it last year, beautiful downtown Loving, New Mexico. Actually, 17 I put cases on last year and orders were issued in Cases 18 19 16317 through 16141. The reason I'm bringing these 20 again is to pool some additional interest owners. As I said, it's the Townsite of Lovington [sic]. It's all 21 22 fee land. There were -- I forget exactly how many but 23 well over 400 interest owners. Not all were pooled. A 24 lot of them were leased. But last year we force pooled 25 a number of interest owners, and some additional updated

title work found several additional interest owners.
They are all unleased mineral owners.

3 And the other thing I wanted to point out is the acreage involved is kind of odd. It's the 4 5 southeast quarter of Section 20 and the southwest б quarter of Section 21. The reason for that is mainly 7 because prior to Kaiser-Francis coming in and force 8 pooling, Wolfcamp wells were drilled all around those 9 two quarter sections. And we did receive approval for nonstandard units last year. We provided that. 10 So I'm 11 going to be fairly summary in my explanation of what's 12 going on. 13 And I've handed you Exhibits 1 through 4 in

the first case, 20286. Exhibit 1 is the affidavit of 14 Mike Maxey, the landman. There are three zones being 15 16 force pooled: the Lower Brushy Canyon, the Bone Spring and the Wolfcamp. This case involves the Bone Spring 17 18 Formation underlying a 160-acre unit comprised of the 19 north half-southeast of Section 20 and the north 20 half-southwest of Section 21. This is in the Culebra Bluff; Bone Spring Pool, pool code 15011. And the 21 22 particular well is called the Loving Townsite 2021 3BS Well #1H. 23 24 MR. BRUCE: Be quiet, Mr. Carr. 25 (Laughter.)

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Page 5 MR. BRUCE: Attached to the affidavit, you 1 2 can see a C-102 for the well showing the well unit. Attachment B shows the additional parties 3 being pooled. You can see that these interests are 4 5 quite small. The rest of the acreage was tied up last year. There is a sample proposal letter sent to the 6 7 interest owners and an AFE for the well. It's about 8 a -- about \$6.7 million well. Exhibit 2 is the Affidavit of Notice for 9 this well. Actually, the subsequent case, 20288, 10 involved the same interest owners, so this particular 11 Affidavit of Notice covers 20286 and 20288. 12 13 A number of people were notified. A lot of green cards didn't come back, so notice was published, 14 and that's marked Exhibit 3. Exhibit 3 is the Affidavit 15 16 of Publication in the Carlsbad newspaper. The notice covers all of these applications. So even though I've 17 made copies of all the notice materials for each 18 19 particular case, a lot of them are repetitive, but I did 20 make copies so that each case file, when I email it in to Ms. Murphy, will have its own set of exhibits. 21 22 And the affidavit of the landman says there are several unlocatable interest owners and describes 23 24 the steps taken to find them. Because the interests 25 being pooled are unleased mineral interests, there are

Page 6 no overriding royalties to force pool. And 1 2 Kaiser-Francis requests \$8,000 a month for a drilling well and \$800 a month for a producing well, which are 3 stated to be fair and reasonable rates. And 4 5 Kaiser-Francis Oil Company requests it be designated operator of the well. 6 7 And with that, I would move the land 8 exhibits, Exhibits 1 through 3. 9 EXAMINER LOWE: Exhibits 1 through 3 are accepted. 10 (Kaiser-Francis Oil Company Exhibit Numbers 11 1, 2 and 3 are offered and admitted into 12 13 evidence.) MR. BRUCE: We are not presenting any 14 geology. We would just ask that the prior geology, 15 16 which was presented last year, be incorporated by reference. 17 18 EXAMINER LOWE: Okay. 19 MR. BRUCE: I'm going to skip a case. That 20 is 20288. It's the same land, the north half -- north half-southeast of Section 20 and the north 21 half-southwest of Section 21. All the land material is 22 23 similar. Again, this is a Delaware well. It's in the 24 East Loving; Brushy Canyon Pool, code 40350. And this is for the Loving Townsite 2021 LBC Well #1H. 25 The

Page 7 affidavit is virtually identical to the one regarding 1 the Bone Spring well. The same lands are involved. The 2 3 same parties are involved. And then Exhibit 2 is the Affidavit of 4 5 Notice, which is the same Affidavit of Notice as for the 6 prior case. 7 And Exhibit 3 is the same Affidavit of 8 Publication as for the prior case. And with that, I'd move the admission of 9 Exhibits 1 through 3 in Case 20288. 10 11 EXAMINER LOWE: The exhibits are admitted 12 for the record. 13 (Kaiser-Francis Oil Company Exhibit Numbers 1, 2 and 3 are offered and admitted into 14 evidence.) 15 16 MR. BRUCE: The next case is Case 20287, which is for a Bone Spring well, in the south 17 half-southeast quarter and the south half-southwest 18 19 quarter, same -- there are slightly -- there is slightly 20 different interest ownership. Again, the affidavit of the landman contains the C-102 for the well. 21 22 Attachment B is the interest owners being 23 pooled. There is some slight difference from that from 24 the prior two cases that I just submitted. And, again, 25 you can see that the interests are extremely small. Ι

Page 8 think the average lot size in Loving Township is 1 somewhere between .1 to .15 acres or something like 2 that. So they're all very small interests. 3 And then along with that is the Affidavit 4 5 of Notice for both cases, 20287 and 20289, and Exhibit 3, which is the Affidavit of Publication, which has 6 7 previously been submitted. Again, these are just 8 additional unleased mineral interest owners. 9 And I'd ask that Exhibits 1 through 3 in Case 20287 be admitted to the record. 10 11 EXAMINER McMILLAN: Exhibits 1 through 3 for Case Number 20287 will be admitted. 12 13 (Kaiser-Francis Oil Company Exhibit Numbers 14 1, 2 and 3 are offered and admitted into evidence.) 15 16 MR. BRUCE: In Case Number 20289, this is for a Lower Brushy Canyon well, again in the south 17 half-southeast of Section 20 and the south half-18 19 southwest quarter of Section 21. So the interest 20 ownership, et cetera, is identical to Case 20287. There is a C-102 for the well, A listing of interest owners, a 21 22 proposal letter and an AFE for the well. Again, some parties were unlocatable, and the affidavit talks about 23 24 the steps taken. All the costs set forth are stated to 25 be fair and reasonable, and for each one of these cases,

Page 9 the same 8,000, \$800 a month overhead rates are 1 2 submitted. 3 Exhibit 2 is the Affidavit of Notice again for Cases 20287 and 20289. 4 5 And Exhibit 3 is the Affidavit of Publication, which is uniform for all of these cases. 6 7 And with that, I'd move the admission of 8 Exhibits 1 through 3 in Case 20289. 9 EXAMINER McMILLAN: Okay. Exhibits for Case Number 20289 will be admitted for the case. 10 11 (Kaiser-Francis Oil Company Exhibit Numbers 1, 2 and 3 are offered and admitted into 12 13 evidence.) MR. BRUCE: And finally I will give you the 14 exhibits for Case 20290, and this is the case where 15 16 force pooling is sought for four Wolfcamp wells. Again, Exhibit 1 is the affidavit of Mike Maxey. 17 18 And I should note that in all of these 19 applications, whether it's the Delaware or the Bone 20 Spring or the Wolfcamp, there are no depth severances in any of these formations. 21 And the affidavit identifies the four 22 23 Wolfcamp wells for which pooling is sought. There are 24 C-102s for each of the wells. 25 Attachment B to the landman's affidavit

Page 10 contains a laundry list of interest owners because it's 1 2 merging the interest ownership with both the north wells and the south-half wells, the Bone Spring and Brushy 3 Canyon wells. And, again, it contains proposal letters, 4 and AFEs for the wells are included. And these wells 5 are about a million dollars more expensive than the 6 7 Lower Brushy Canyon or the Bone Spring wells. 8 EXAMINER BROOKS: Just a little bit more 9 expensive. 10 MR. BRUCE: What's that? 11 EXAMINER BROOKS: I say it sounds like 12 they're just a little bit more expensive. 13 MR. BRUCE: Not too much more (laughter). EXAMINER BROOKS: A paltry million dollars. 14 MR. BRUCE: A million here, a million 15 16 there. Next thing you know, you're talking real money. 17 Again, 8,000, 800 a month is requested. 18 Exhibit 2 is the Affidavit of Notice of 19 mailings sent to all the Wolfcamp interest owners. And, 20 again, there were unlocatable people, so notice was published against all of these people. 21 And Exhibit 3 is the affidavit -- the 22 common Affidavit of Publication for all of these wells. 23 And with that, I would move the admission 24 25 of Exhibits 1 through 3 in Case Number 20290.

Page 11 EXAMINER LOWE: Exhibits 1 through 3 for 1 2 Case 20290 will be accepted. (Kaiser-Francis Oil Company Exhibit Numbers 3 1, 2 and 3 are offered and admitted into 4 5 evidence.) MR. BRUCE: With that, I'd ask that these 6 7 cases be taken under advisement. 8 EXAMINER LOWE: Any questions, Michael? 9 EXAMINER McMILLAN: Okay. My question is: Were those the same overhead rates for the previous 10 11 cases? 12 MR. BRUCE: I meant to look that up, 13 Mr. Examiner. I knew you would ask. If they are not, we will accept the rates in the original order. I think 14 they are, but I don't remember. 15 16 EXAMINER McMILLAN: Okay. Yeah. I have to ask that. 17 18 So I'm trying to -- you just simply have 19 additional interests that you're pooling, right? And 20 the original ones you're pooling and subject to that case are essentially an add-on? 21 22 MR. BRUCE: Yes. Yes. I think in the 23 original case -- I forget how many people were force 24 pooled, 100 or something like that, and they have leased 25 up -- whether Kaiser-Francis or other companies have

Page 12 leased up several hundred other interest owners, and 1 2 these just kind of popped up. 3 EXAMINER McMILLAN: Okay. EXAMINER LOWE: I've got one question here. 4 5 You indicated, for Case Number 20286, the initial one you presented, that you wanted to use the geology from 6 7 the previous case. MR. BRUCE: Yeah. For all of these, I 8 would ask that the geology be. 9 EXAMINER LOWE: For all? 10 11 MR. BRUCE: Yeah. Those cases -- as I 12 mentioned, we did present geology on each of the Delaware, Bone Spring and Wolfcamp in those cases, 16137 13 through 16141. 14 15 EXAMINER LOWE: Okay. 16 EXAMINER McMILLAN: What are the status of 17 the wells? 18 MR. BRUCE: The Wolfcamp wells have been 19 drilled. I think one of them might still be drilled. Ι 20 think the others have not been drilled. I will find 21 out. 22 EXAMINER McMILLAN: Yeah. So send an email 23 to clarify the status of all the wells. 24 EXAMINER LOWE: Case Numbers 20286, 20287, 25 20288, 20289 and 20290 will be taken under advisement.
