P R O C E E D I N G S

MR. FUGE: All right. Good morning, everyone. This is the June 8th meeting of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission called to order. I'm going to go ahead -- because I know the audio is a little tricky here -- and just call roll as we kick things off this morning. It is a relatively brief agenda, so we'll go ahead and get started.

Commissioner Bloom?

MR. BLOOM: Present.

MR. FUGE: Commissioner Ampomah?

MR. AMPOMAH: Present.

MR. FUGE: Let the record reflect that the chair is also present.

My fellow commissioners, have you had a chance to review the agenda for today's meeting? Do you have any comments or additions?

MR. BLOOM: Yes, I -- I did get a chance to review that, and, Mr. Chair, probably the only thing I would want to discuss potentially at some point, I believe I saw a rulemaking petition related to PFAS. And I don't know if we're going to be talking about that today, but I thought it'd be worth mentioning.

MR. FUGE: I'm happy to cover that in

1 other -- other business briefly, for the record, and
2 just give a sense of where that position is and next
3 steps.

4 Can I get a motion to -- the agenda?

5 MR. BLOOM: Mr. Chair, I so move.

6 MR. AMPOMAH: Mr. Chair, I second.

7 MR. FUGE: Let the record reflect the
8 agenda was approved unanimously.

9 The minutes for the May 11, 2023,
10 meeting were distributed to the commissioners. Do
11 folks have any comments or edits to those minutes?

12 MR. BLOOM: No, Mr. Chair. I had an
13 opportunity to review those and would move to adopt
14 the minutes from our previous meeting.

15 MR. AMPOMAH: Mr. Chair, I do second,
16 as well.

17 MR. FUGE: Let the record reflect the
18 minutes were approved unanimously.

19 Next item on the agenda is adjustments
20 to dates for our upcoming meeting. It is summer
21 vacation season, and I'd like to keep the commission
22 moving at -- at a normal place [sic] but also respect
23 we've got -- got a small commission. So keeping a --
24 keeping a quorum intact is important.

25 Based on some feedback collected solely

1 related to scheduling from the other commissioners, we
2 are going to move the August 2023 meeting date, which
3 is currently set for August 10th. And we are going to
4 shift it to August 17, 2023.

5 I do recognize that that is also on the
6 same date that the division holds its own hearings,
7 but some conflicts are unavoidable. We'll work with
8 folks to sort of manage schedules there.

9 Similarly, for the September 2023
10 meeting, which is currently scheduled for September
11 14th, we are going to move that up to September 7,
12 2023, based on feedback from commissions. We will
13 update the schedule on the website to reflect those
14 changes. And obviously no other adjustments to filing
15 rules, any of the other stuff. Same notice -- notice
16 requirements will apply, same -- same computation.
17 But those are the adjusted dates.

18 Again, that is August 17, 2023, for the
19 August meeting and September 7, 2023, for the
20 September meeting this year. And we'll make sure
21 those changes are reflected on the OCC website.

22 MR. BLOOM: Mr. -- Mr. Chairman?

23 MR. FUGE: Yep?

24 MR. BLOOM: Maybe two questions. Do we
25 anticipate needing to meet the Friday after those

1 Thursday meetings? Do you -- do you anticipate two-
2 day meetings?

3 MR. FUGE: I do not anticipate two-day
4 meetings at this time, but -- but because the docket
5 is fluid I will communicate and share with the
6 commissioner -- with the commissioners as soon as
7 we've got a better sense of what the docket looks
8 like. We had a pretty full docket coming into this
9 meeting, and it entirely disappeared. So -- but
10 we'll -- we'll know as we put it together for the
11 initial meeting notice, and I'll -- and I'll
12 communicate thoughts accordingly.

13 MR. RUBIN: If I may, I -- first, good
14 morning, commissioners. My name is Dan Rubin. I'm
15 with the attorney general's office. And I've been
16 assigned to represent the -- the OCC. I look forward
17 to working with all three of you.

18 One question that came up in my mind
19 when you move -- moving the meeting to August 17th --
20 and as Commissioner Bloom has noted, there is a
21 pending petition for rulemaking. Would we be able to
22 decide whether to proceed with rulemaking within
23 these -- within the timeframe necessary?

24 MR. FUGE: Yes.

25 MR. RUBIN: Okay.

1 MR. FUGE: Yep. I'll -- like I said,
2 I'll -- I'll hit that scheduling piece shortly so
3 that -- so that we can -- we can cover it with the
4 shift. So does -- does that work, Commissioner Bloom?

5 MR. BLOOM: Yes, absolutely. And
6 the -- the one other thing I wanted to flag, I have
7 to -- on July 13th I have an obligation that'll extend
8 to about noon. I could meet as soon as noon that day,
9 Thursday, July 13th, our regularly scheduled meeting.
10 I am free to meet that Friday, as well. But I needed
11 the late start that day.

12 MR. FUGE: So if we started the July
13 13th meeting at noon, you could carry it over on a
14 Friday?

15 MR. BLOOM: Yes.

16 MR. FUGE: Okay. We will -- we'll take
17 that back. And I have -- I have no trouble doing a
18 delayed start on Thursday, July 13th. We'll -- we'll
19 put it on the calendar to start at noon, and we'll
20 make sure the notice reflects that when it goes out in
21 advance of that meeting.

22 MR. BLOOM: Thank you.

23 MR. FUGE: In terms of pending cases,
24 there are none on the docket today, as -- as reflected
25 in the agenda that we circulated. Those cases were

1 continued to August and September 2023. Our
2 adjustments to the dates for those meetings apply to
3 those continued cases. And again, I'll encourage
4 counsel for those cases to communicate with us as to
5 status, timing, and scheduling of them. Some of them
6 have been on the docket for a little while now.

7 Daniel, thank you for introducing
8 myself [sic]. My apologies for not introducing our
9 new attorney from Open Government in the Office of
10 Attorney General. So thank you for stepping in and
11 flagging; I appreciate it.

12 We had a couple items under pending --
13 pending litigation. Not sure there are any detailed
14 flags, and I don't think we need to go into executive
15 session but wanted if you could just give those brief
16 notes?

17 MR. RUBIN: Oh. Well, really the only
18 case I'd have anything to add on is the Attencio case,
19 which was filed, and as chair -- Chairman Fuge has
20 informed me this morning, there has been an agreement
21 with the plaintiff's counsel to extend the deadline 60
22 days to answer. I can say that the AG's office is
23 coordinating with the governor's office, and the fact
24 that the legislature is also party to this case, there
25 are fair many moving parts and coordinating in events.

1 As to whether there's any conflicts, we're not in a
2 closed session, so I'm really limited as to what I can
3 say. But right now we're still at a very preliminary
4 point this -- with this case.

5 MR. FUGE: I would anticipate going
6 forward, commissioners, that we will have some closed
7 sessions to discuss the status of the litigation and
8 other sort of strategic decisions we're making at this
9 time. After talking with Mr. Rubin, we decided it
10 wasn't necessary today because it's so new and there's
11 still a lot of that back-end coordination that's
12 occurring.

13 MR. RUBIN: Yes.

14 MR. FUGE: I'll flag the Marker vs. Oil
15 Conservation Commission case. The court of appeals
16 issued a very, very short decision -- only two
17 pages -- and affectively affirmed the District Court's
18 orders, its finding of fact, and its conclusions of
19 law. So the OCC prevailed and -- but it still -- so
20 he has an opportunity to file for cert. So --

21 MR. RUBIN: Right, 30 days.

22 MR. FUGE: Thirty days. So we will see
23 if that occurs and provide an update there.

24 In terms of other business,
25 Commissioner Bloom, what I was going to cover, we did

1 get that PFAS petition. The OCC clerk circulated it
2 to you as required by our regs. Our regs have an
3 interesting provision about such petitions; they
4 require us to consider that -- they require us to add
5 a public meeting to determine if we're going to take
6 up the petition for rulemaking. And the meeting has
7 to be no sooner than 15 days and no later than 60
8 days.

9 Because of when the petition was filed,
10 it was, like, 11 days out from this meeting or
11 something like that -- maybe 13 -- so not within the
12 15-day window. It will be on the docket for that
13 preliminary determination at the July 13, 2023,
14 meeting.

15 And again, the purpose of that
16 discussion and presentation is to give parties who
17 want to participate in the rulemaking a chance to
18 enter an appearance, not to get into the substance at
19 all but merely just get enough of a substance on it so
20 we as a commission can make a decision whether we want
21 to carry it forward into rulemaking.

22 And then we can begin setting a -- as
23 part of that discussion we'll need to set a schedule
24 for rulemaking, and obviously that's going to be
25 worked out with any parties who enter an appearance in

1 the matter. So you will see that on the agenda that's
2 published in advance of the July 13th meeting, and
3 we'll take that initial procedural step there.

4 MR. BLOOM: Very good, Mr. Chair.
5 Thank you. Thank you. Appreciate it.

6 MR. FUGE: And so -- and I will make
7 sure that in advance of the meeting that the
8 commissioners, in addition to getting the petition --
9 you know, I -- I have asked the AG's Office for just
10 confirmation that, you know -- we'll have in advance
11 of the meeting just confirmation that, you know, the
12 petition meets the applicable requirements so that,
13 you know, we can -- we can factor that in, to [sic]
14 well. But that would be, I suspect, first up on the
15 agenda on the -- on the 13th meeting.

16 And I'm just going to look out to
17 the -- to the folks in attendance to see if there are
18 any questions before I wrap it up. As I said, this
19 was going to be a abbreviated meeting. Let's give
20 folks a minute.

21 All right, seeing none, our next
22 meeting is at July 13, 2023. We are going to have a
23 delayed start until noon Mountain Time. And that
24 meeting will in all likelihood -- based on cases that
25 have continued and what's on the docket I think the --

1 that the -- the commission should plan on that being a
2 two-day meeting that spills over into Friday.

3 And again, our hearing room at the
4 Wendell Chino Building is very close. And I know I
5 say it's very close; it is actually very close. It
6 had the fancy wood paneling up; it just needs the tech
7 set up. So I hope to be at our more permanent home
8 later this year. I think we are on track.

9 And with that I will adjourn the
10 meeting. Thanks, everyone. See you on the 13th.
