APPLICANT'S STATEMENT OF CASE

Applicant seeks an order allowing the trench burial of salt impacted soil pursuant to a surface re-vegetation and remediation plan approved by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) for a 1970's era produced water disposal pit at the ARCO Federal Well No. 1 Tank Battery (API No. 30-015-20631). This federal land is located in Section 17, Township 17 South, Range 30 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico.

Following the reporting of a minor spill on this ARCO Federal Well No. 1 Tank Battery, the BLM requested that the Applicant develop a plan for removing salt impacted soil and revegetating the area to improve the general habitat. As part of the process, Applicant and the BLM employed a Net Environmental Benefit Analysis to determine the best means of disposing of the salt impacted soil. Following this analysis, the BLM approved trench burial of the salt impacted soil at this federal well site as part of the overall remediation plan designed to improve the vegetation and habitat at this location. In June, Applicant submitted the BLM approved remediation plan to the Oil Conservation Division pursuant to NMAC 19.15.29.11. Citing NMAC 19.15.34.11, the Division by letter dated June 25, 2011, denied the BLM approved surface remediation plan, stating:

OCD is not requiring Southwest Royalties to conduct corrective action at this site because there is no protectable water and no threat to human health. Surface remediation for revegetation purposes should be completed pursuant to the surface land management's requirements.

However, OCD will not allow Southwest Royalties to dispose of contaminated soil in a pit and hereby denies Southwest Royalties proposed surface remedy. OCD again suggests that Southwest Royalties confer with the BLM about what surface restoration BLM is requiring.

It is undisputed that no protectable groundwater exists in this area and that this salt impacted soil poses no threat to human health. The BLM has determined that trench burial of this salt impacted soil at this federal well site is the best means of achieving the desired revegetation and habitat improvement. Accordingly, Applicant requests that the Division grant an exception to the general prohibition set forth in Rule 34.11 either as an approved remediation plan pursuant to Part 29 (which is a regulatory exception to Rule 34.11); as a matter of comity to

Mr. Gonzales:

The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has reviewed the proposal submitted by R.T. Hicks Consultants (RTH) on behalf of Southwest Royalties on June 20, 2011 to address a release of produced water at the Southwest Royalties ARCO Federal No. 1 tank battery, API No. 30-015-20631, located in Unit Letter K, Section 17, Township 17 South, Range 30 East, in Eddy County, New Mexico. This is the same proposal that Southwest Royalties had previously submitted to the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). By letter dated June 16, 2011, OCD informed Southwest Royalties that it was prohibited from disposing of remediation waste in a pit by 19.15.34.11 NMAC (*Disposition of Produced Water and Other Oil Field Waste*), except as authorized by other OCD rules.

Southwest Royalties has resubmitted its proposal as a "Remediation Plan" pursuant to 19.15.29.11 NMAC (*Corrective Action*). OCD is not requiring Southwest Royalties to conduct corrective action at this site because there is no protectable water and no threat to human health. Surface remediation for revegetation purposes should be completed pursuant to the surface land management's requirements.

However, OCD will not allow Southwest Royalties to dispose of contaminated soil in a pit and hereby denies Southwest Royalties' proposed surface remedy. OCD again suggests that Southwest Royalties confer with BLM about what surface restoration BLM is requiring.
