**APPLICATION OF COG OPERATING LLC TO INCREASE WELL DENSITY IN THE
DODD FEDERAL UNIT, EDDY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.**

COG Operating LLC ("Concho"), through its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application pursuant to Division Rule 19.15.15.11(C) NMAC for an order providing for an exception to the oil well density limits within the horizontal limits of the Dodd Federal Unit, Grayburg Jackson Seven Rivers-Queen-Grayburg-San Andres Pool and Grayburg Jackson Yeso Pool (or the proposed Dodd Glorieta-Yeso Pool), Eddy County, New Mexico and in support thereof, states as follows:

1. Concho is the designated operator of the Dodd Federal Unit which consists of the following acreage:

3. The Grayburg Jackson Yeso Pool was created by Division Order No. R-12256, dated January 3, 2005 and is co-extensive with the horizontal boundaries of the Dodd Federal Unit and was vertically extended to include the Glorieta and Yeso/Paddock intervals. This pool was extended and renamed from the larger Grayburg Jackson Pool noted above.

4. In Case No. 14669, Concho applied to contract the Grayburg Jackson and Grayburg Jackson Yeso pools within the Dodd Federal Unit to vertically extend from the top of the Seven Rivers to the top of the Glorieta formation. Concho has also requested the creation of a

new pool which would extend from the top of the Glorieta formation to the top of the Tubb formation (proposed to be named the Dodd Glorieta Yeso Pool). That matter was heard on September 29, 2011 and is under advisement with the Division.

5. The Grayburg Jackson pools are governed by Division Rule 19.15.15.9 NMAC which provides that a 40-acre spacing unit may contain up to four wells.

6. Concho requests an exception to the Division well density rule to increase well density to allow up to 4 wells completed in the Paddock member and 4 wells in the Blinebry member of the Glorieta-Yeso formation.

7. Concho believes this spacing is necessary for incremental recovery.

8. Exhibit A to this application is a list of affected persons as defined by Division Rules. Concho has given notice to the listed parties in accordance with Division Rules.

9. Approval of this application will result in the production of hydrocarbons which otherwise will not be produced and will be in the best interest of conservation and the protection of correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, COG Operating LLC requests that this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on November 10, 2011, that notice be given as required by law and the rules of the Division, and that the application be approved.
