- 1 CHAIRMAN BROOKS: Good morning, ladies and
- gentlemen. Mr. Ezeanyim wants to make some
- announcements before we commence the docket.
- 4 (Discussion off the record.)
- 5 CHAIRMAN BROOKS: We'll call to order on
- 6 the record OCD Docket Number 19-12. And as usual,
- 7 the first order of business is to call the
- 8 continuances and dismissals.
- 9 On the first page, Case 14863, continued
- 10 to July 12.
- 11 Case Number 14864, continued to July 12.
- On the second page, Case Number 14865,
- 13 continued to July 12.
- Case Number 14866, continued to July 12.
- 15 Case Number 14869, continued to July 12.
- On the third page, Case Number 14858, was
- 17 dismissed.
- Case Number (14859) was dismissed.
- 19 Case Number 14870, continued to July 12.
- On the fourth page, no continuances or
- 21 dismissals were recorded.
- On the fifth page, no continuances or
- 23 dismissals.
- On the sixth page, and final page, Case
- 25 Number 13940, continued to July 26.

- 1 And I would note that that case has been
- 2 continued probably as many times as any in the
- 3 history of OCD, but it's reached a new milestone
- 4 today, because this is the third continuance since
- 5 we entered the three continuance policies;
- 6 therefore, on July 26, that will be a do or die
- 7 situation.
