- 1 14852, and it is 14582 on the docket, and the -- the --
- 2 someone made a mistake here, because 14852 is the
- 3 application of COG Operating, LLC for nonstandard,
- 4 et cetera, et cetera. Case Number 14582 is the
- 5 application of Cimarex Energy Company for approval of a
- 6 nonstandard, et cetera, et cetera, motion to reopen. So
- 7 14582 is continued to June the 7th. And 14852,
- 8 presumably, is not even on the docket.
- 9 EXAMINER WARNELL: No, it is. It is.
