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1 (8:15 a.m.) EXAMINER EZEANYIM: Good morning, 2 everybody. 3 We will come to order. And before I proceed, I need to make a couple of announcements, 4 5 minor. As we all know, the Horizontal Well Rule is 6 7 now in effect, and there are certain provisions in that 8 rule that you-all should know about. One of them that we encounter every time we have a hearing is, when you 9 request for a non-standard spacing unit and you're going 10 to drill a well, you know we define that as completed 11 12 interval. Now I would like you to give us your well 13 construction diagram showing that, when you present your 14 cases from now on. Maybe today -- I haven't made that 15 announcement before, but today you might say, Yeah, I'm 16 going to give you the completed interval; however, I'm 17 going to give you the construction diagram to show us 18 that within the -- depending on how you constructed your 19 well; you have casings or no casings or something. We 20 are saying, Give us a completed diagram of the well construction diagram. That's one important thing I 21 22 wanted to -- I know that is news to everybody. So 23 whenever you are coming, make sure you give it. Today I 24 may not require it, because you're not aware of that. 25 Awhile ago we made an announcement that a

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Page 3 new policy is now in effect just to help us to de-clog 1 2 our dockets. What happens is that people continue to 3 continue their cases indefinitely, and every time -- and so we're not going to have that anymore. 4 So we started that, and last time I had told you that. Second 5 continuances will be granted for only third time. After 6 7 that, the case will be dismissed without prejudice. You don't have to request for dismissal. If you want to 8 9 continue, it's not going to be allowed. It has to be dismissed without prejudice. 10 11 On the cases today, I want to do that to 12 see if we can have a docket -- so we want you to plan ahead and see what you want to do. Of course, if you 13 want to continue -- if you want to continue it, it can 14 be a long, but anytime time you want, that's one 15 16 continuance. But once you get to three times, we are 17 going to have to dismiss without prejudice. 18 With that being said, I would like to give an opportunity for any comments. Any comments? 19 Is there anything I didn't make clear? 20 21 No comments. Okay. Now, with that, we'll go to the docket. 22 23 Today we have Docket Number 11-12. And I guess 24 everybody knows, whoever -- everybody that's here, the 25 first thing we do is discuss continuances and other

We'll go to page 1. Case Number 14809 is continued to April 26th. Case Number 14810 is continued to April 26th.

5 On page 2, Case Number 14811 is continued 6 until May the 10th. Case Number 14787 is continued 7 until May 10th. And as I said, now, this is the final 8 continuance. The next time, this case has to be heard. 9 That is May the 10th. When I say May the 10th, it has 10 to be heard May 10th; otherwise, it will be dismissed 11 without prejudice.
