WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2:05 p.m.: 2 3 4 EXAMINER STOGNER: This hearing will come to 5 order. 6 At this time I'm going to call Case Number 7 This is the Application of the New Mexico Oil 8 Conservation Division for an order requiring Shanley Oil 9 Company to properly plug one certain well in Roosevelt 10 County, New Mexico, and for an order forfeiting the 11 applicable plugging bond for that well. 12 At this time I'll call for appearances. 13 MR. BROOKS: Mr. Examiner, I'm David Brooks, 14 Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department of the 15 State of New Mexico, appearing for the New Mexico Oil 16 17 Conservation Division. I have two witnesses, they've both been 18 19 previously sworn. They've both been sworn in the immediately preceding proceeding. 20 EXAMINER STOGNER: The record will so reflect 21 that. I'll remind both of you that you're still under 22 23 oath. Nobody else is in the room, so you may continue, Mr. Brooks. 24 25 MR. BROOKS: Very good, we call Dorothy Phillips.

DOROTHY L. PHILLIPS, 1 the witness herein, having been previously duly sworn upon 2 her oath, was examined and testified as follows: 3 DIRECT EXAMINATION 4 BY MR. BROOKS: 5 Ms. Phillips, would you state your name for the 6 Q. record, please? 7 Dorothy Phillips. 8 Α. And by whom are you employed? 9 Q. The New Mexico Oil Conservation Division. 10 Α. In what capacity? 11 Q. I am the plugging bond administrator. 12 Α. Do you have a file on Shanley Oil Company? 13 Q. 14 A. Yes, sir, I do. And I'll call your attention to the exhibits that 15 Q. I placed beside you there, Exhibits Numbers 7 and 8 in this 16 proceeding, and can you identify those? 17 18 Α. Exhibit Number 7 is a one-well plugging bond for 19 Shanley Petrogas, Inc. And what well -- Does it identify the well, up in 20 0. 21 the upper right-hand corner, just below the bond number and amount? 22 23 The Harris 1-14. Α. 24 Okay. And who is the surety on that bond? Q. 25 Northwestern National Insurance Company.

1	Q. Very good. Then could you identify Exhibit
2	Number 8?
3	A. That is a rider to Bond LSC 464743, which is the
4	blanket bond I mean, which is the one-well bond.
5	Q. Which is Exhibit 7?
6	A. Exhibit 8.
7	Q. I mean, is Bond Number LSC 464743 is that
8	Exhibit 7?
9	A. That's correct.
10	Q. Okay. And what does that rider do?
11	A. It amends the principal's name from Shanley Oil
12	Company from Shanley Petrogas, Inc., to Shanley Oil
13	Company.
14	Q. Very good. Now, referring to your bond file
15	which you have there on Shanley Oil Company, are Exhibits
16	Numbers 7 and 8 true and correct copies of original
17	documents that are in your bond file that you maintain for
18	the Oil Conservation Division?
19	A. Yes, sir.
20	Q. Are those files maintained by you in the ordinary
21	course of your business with the Oil Conservation Division?
22	A. That's correct.
23	MR. BROOKS: We tender Exhibits 7 and 8.
24	EXAMINER STOGNER: Exhibits 7 and 8 will be
25	admitted into evidence at this time.

MR. BROOKS: Pass the witness. 1 EXAMINER STOGNER: No questions. 2 MR. BROOKS: Very good. We'll call Billy 3 Prichard. 4 BILLY PRICHARD (Present by Telephone), 5 the witness herein, after having been first duly sworn upon 6 his oath, was examined and testified as follows: 7 DIRECT EXAMINATION 8 BY MR. BROOKS: 9 Would you state your name for the record, please? 10 Q. Billy Prichard, Compliance Officer, District 1, 11 Α. OCD. 12 Very good. Mr. Prichard -- Well, first of all, 13 0. 14 Mr. Examiner, Exhibit Number 1 was prepared by me. It is a summary of information from the well file. 15 It's just 16 really for illustrative -- just to give you an idea of what we're dealing with here. It may not be totally accurate, 17 but I just took this information from the well file. 18 19 And of course Exhibit Number 2 is Ms. Prouty's 20 affidavit. 21 Mr. Prichard, we'll call your attention to 22 Exhibit Number 3 and Exhibit Number 4 and Exhibit Number 5 23 and Exhibit Number 6. Are all of these exhibits documents 24 that are included in the well file for Shanley Oil Company

Harris "14" Well Number 1, API Number 30-041-20342?

1	A. Yes, they are, they're maintained in the Hobbs
2	District well file.
3	Q. Okay, would you identify each go through these
4	exhibits and identify what each one of them is and what it
5	tells us about this well?
6	A. Okay. Exhibit 3, it's the C-101 and it is the
7	intent to drill the well, by Ted Weiner. And it was
8	approved in 1972.
9	Q. Okay, Exhibit Number 4?
10	A. Exhibit Number 4 is a 105, and it is the
11	completion report of the Harris well by Ted Weiner I'm
12	not sure I'm pronouncing that right of the Harris "14"
13	Number 1.
14	Q. Well, I don't know how to pronounce it either, so
15	I can't tell you.
16	EXAMINER STOGNER: Let's stick with Weiner.
17	THE WITNESS: Okay, I figured we would.
18	And it was approved Well, it wasn't actually
19	approved, it was just accepted on May 18th of 1972.
20	Q. (By Mr. Brooks) Correct, and Exhibit Number 5?
21	A. Exhibit Number 5 is a C-104 showing ownership
22	change from Ted Weiner to Threshold Development.
23	Q. And Exhibit Number 6?
24	A. It is a C-104 showing change of ownership from
25	Threshold Development Company to Shanley Oil Company.

Okay. And all those files, you've already said, 1 Q. were from the records of the OCD maintained in your office 2 on particular wells, correct? 3 Yes, that's correct. 4 Now, are you acquainted with this Harris "14" 1 5 Q. well? 6 Yes, I am. 7 Α. And I believe your qualifications as a well 8 Q. inspector were accepted by the Division in a previous 9 hearing, and can you tell us in your opinion as a well 10 inspector, does this well need to be plugged in the 11 interest of protecting the environment, preventing waste 12 13 and protecting correlative rights? Α. Yes, it does, it does need to be plugged. 14 And do you know how long this well has been 15 Q. inactive? 16 I believe since 1984 is what I found. 17 Α. Okay, that's the information that we had also, 18 19 and it appears on Exhibit 1. 20 Did you prepare a plugging procedure for the Shanley Harris "14" 1? 21 22 Yes, I did. A. 23 And is that Exhibit 9? Q. 24 Yes, it is. Α. If the well were plugged in accordance with that 25 Q.

1	procedure, would it be properly plugged and abandoned in
2	accordance with OCD Rules 101 and 202?
3	A. Yes, it sure would.
4	MR. BROOKS: We'll tender Exhibits 3, 4, 5, 6 and
5	9.
6	EXAMINER STOGNER: Exhibits 3, 4, 5, 6 you did
7	say 5, right?
8	MR. BROOKS: 3, 4, 5, 6 and 9.
9	EXAMINER STOGNER: 3, 4, 5, 6 and 9 will be
10	admitted into evidence at this time.
11	MR. BROOKS: Pass the witness.
12	EXAMINATION
13	BY EXAMINER STOGNER:
14	Q. What is the surface condition out there around
15	this wellhead, Mr. Prichard?
16	A. It's all grown up. The well hasn't been There
17	hasn't been any activity around the well in years. Fact
18	is, the road is completely washed out and gone, getting in
19	to the well.
20	There is one old tank and one old stack pack out
21	there on location, but the wellhead is sitting
22	disconnected. Like I say, it's been idle for 18 years.
23	Q. And what is the general location? Is there any
24	nearby towns or buildings or
25	A. Yes. It's approximately 14 miles west of Dora,

1	New Mexico and approximately 12 miles south of It is
2	essentially ranch land.
3	There are no residents anywhere close to this
4	well.
5	Q. So it's what, mainly cow pasture?
6	A. Cow pasture.
7	Q. So there's livestock around the fields where the
8	well is located?
9	A. Yes, there is livestock in the pasture.
10	Q. Okay. Is there any nearby windmills or water
11	sources?
12	A. No, it's relatively flat country, doesn't seem
13	like there is a windmill any closer than a half a mile.
14	EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, I have no other
15	questions of Mr. Prichard.
16	Do you have anything further, Mr. Brooks?
17	MR. BROOKS: Not for Mr. Prichard.
18	I would submit the affidavit of Jane Prouty as
19	Exhibit Number 2.
20	EXAMINER STOGNER: Exhibit Number 2, and this is
21	essentially a production
22	MR. BROOKS: It authenticates a printout
23	indicating that no C-115s have been filed on this well in
24	the past five years.
25	EXAMINER STOCKER: I'll accept Exhibit Number 2

at this time and make note of Exhibit Number 1 and take 1 administrative notice of the Division's files on this well. 2 MR. BROOKS: Okay. And I will further suggest 3 that I believe -- I have lost my cheat sheet here, for some 4 reason, but I believe the case file will reflect that a 5 receipt -- a return receipt is in the file. 6 7 Yes, the case file does reflect that a return receipt of notice to Shanley Oil Company signed by John F. 8 Shanley, and notice to Northwestern National Insurance 9 Company signed by John Breyer -- or Beyer, I can't read it 10 for sure. 11 (By Examiner Stogner) Well, that brings up --12 0. Mr. Prichard, if you're still -- you're still on the 13 line --14 15 A. Yes. 16 Q. -- and you're still under oath. Have you talked 17 to Mr. Shanley? Α. No, I haven't. 18 19 I have sent, I believe, two letters total to 20 Shanley, and I'd have to look at the file. 21 Okay. Q. 22 Α. But they have been corresponded with. EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, no other questions. 23 Anything further, Mr. Brooks? 24 25 MR. BROOKS: No, your Honor, that will constitute

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the Division's case.
