APPLICATION OF MEWBOURNE OIL COMPANY FOR A NON-STANDARD OIL SPACING AND PRORATION UNIT AND COMPULSORY POOLING, EDDY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.

APPLICATION

Mewbourne Oil Company applies for an order (i) approving a non-standard oil spacing and proration unit in the Bone Spring formation comprised of the N½N½ of Section 27, Township 18 South, Range 30 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico, and (ii) pooling all mineral interests in the Bone Spring formation underlying the non-standard unit, and in support thereof, states:

- 1. Applicant is an interest owner in the N½N½ of Section 27, and has the right to drill a well thereon.
- 2. Applicant has drilled its Ursa 27 DA Fed. Com. Well No. 4H to a depth sufficient to test the Bone Spring formation. Applicant seeks to dedicate the N½N½ of Section 27 to the well to form a non-standard 160 acre oil spacing and proration unit (project area) in the Bone Spring formation for all pools developed on 40 acre spacing. The well is a horizontal well, with a surface location in the NW¼NW¼, and a terminus in the NE¼NE¼, of Section 27.
- 3. Applicant has in good faith sought to obtain the voluntary joinder of all other mineral interest owners in the N½N½ of Section 27 for the purposes set forth herein.
- 4. Although applicant attempted to obtain voluntary agreements from all mineral interest owners to participate in the drilling of the well or to otherwise commit their interests to the well, certain interest owners have failed or refused to join in dedicating their interests.

Therefore, applicant seeks an order pooling all mineral interest owners in the N½N½ of Section 27, pursuant to NMSA 1978 §§70-2-17, 18.

5. Approval of the non-standard unit, and the pooling of all mineral interests underlying the N½N½ of Section 27, will prevent the drilling of unnecessary wells, prevent waste, and protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, applicant requests that, after notice and hearing, the Division enter its order:

- A. Approving a non-standard oil spacing and proration unit (project area) in the Bone Spring formation comprised of the N½N½ of Section 27;
- B. Pooling all mineral interests in the Bone Spring formation underlying the N½N½ of Section 27; and
- C. Designating applicant as operator of the well.

Application of Mewbourne Oil Company for a non-standard oil spacing and proration unit and compulsory pooling, Eddy County, New Mexico. Mewbourne Oil Company seeks an order approving a 160-acre non-standard oil spacing and proration unit (project area) in the Bone Spring formation comprised of the N/2N/2 of Section 27, Township 18 South, Range 30 East, NMPM. Applicant further seeks the pooling of all mineral interests in the Bone Spring formation underlying the N/2N/2 of Section 27 to form a non-standard 160 acre oil spacing and proration unit (project area) for all pools or formations developed on 40 acre spacing within that vertical extent. The unit is to be dedicated to the Ursa 27 DA Fed. Com. Well No. 4H, a horizontal well with a surface location in the NW/4NW/4, and a terminus in the NE/4NE/4, of Section 27. Also to be considered will be the designation of applicant as operator of the well. The unit is located approximately 7 miles south-southeast of Loco Hills, New Mexico.

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
