CASE Application Of Cobalt Operating, LLC For Authorization to Inject Produced Water for Disposal, Lea County, New Mexico. Applicant seeks authority to deepen and convert the Warren No. 2 (API No. 30-025-26953) to a saltwater disposal well. Said well is located 2200 feet from the North line, 880 feet from the East line (Unit H), Section 8, Township 17 South, Range 37 East. The proposed injection zone is within the Devonian formation at a depth of 11,760 feet to 12,580 feet. Maximum injection rate will be 3,000 bwpd at a maximum surface injection pressure of 2,352 psi. This well is located approximately 8 miles Southeast of Lovington, New Mexico.
