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COG Operating LLC, ("COG"), through its undersigned attorneys, hereby files this application with the Oil Conservation Division pursuant to the provisions of N.M. Stat. Ann. § 70-2-17, for an order (1) creating a 160-acre, more or less, non-standard spacing and proration unit comprised of the E/2 E/2 of Section 36, Township 19 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico; and (2) pooling the record title owner of State Lease E0-6005-0003 covering the E/2 SE/4 of Section 36, Township 19 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, in the Bone Spring formation. In support of this application COG states:

APPLICATION

COG owns a working interest in the E/2 E/2 of Section 36 and proposes 1. to dedicate the above-referenced spacing and proration unit as the project area for its proposed West Pearl 36 State Com No 3H Well, which will be horizontally drilled from a surface location in the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 25 to a standard bottom hole location in the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 36. The completed interval for this well will begin in the NE/4 NE/4 (Unit A) and terminate in the SE/4 SE/4 (Unit P) of Section 36.

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2. This project area is located within the Lea; Bone Spring Pool (37570). The completed interval for this well will remain within the 330-foot standard offset required by the Statewide Rules set forth in 19.15.15 NMAC.

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3. COG has attempted but has been unable to reach agreement with record title owner of State Lease E0-6005-0003 covering the E/2 SE/4 of Section 36:

4. In order to allow COG to communitize this state lease with the remaining tracts of land comprising the E/2 E/2 of Section 36, this record title interest needs to be pooled and COG designated operator of the well and spacing unit.

5. Approval of this application will avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, will prevent waste, will protect correlative rights, and allow COG and the other interest owners in the E/2 E/2 of Section 36 an opportunity to obtain their just and fair share of the oil and gas underlying the subject lands.

WHEREFORE, COG requests that this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on July 23, 2015, and that after notice and hearing as required by law the Division enter its order:

- Creating a 160-acre, more or less, non-standard spacing and proration unit in the Bone Spring formation, comprised of the E/2 E/2 of Section 36, Township 19 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico;
- B. Pooling the record title interest in State Lease E0-6005-0003 for the purpose of forming a 160-acre non-standard spacing and proration unit; and

C. Designating COG Operating LLC operator of this non-standard spacing unit and the horizontal well to be drilled thereon.
