"Tastes of Harding County" enhances Harding County economic assessment

A tempting array of delicious gourmet foods created excitement for guests strolling by six tables of food stations offering samples of family recipes. Volunteer chefs included Bill and Neita Fran Ward's Barbequed Baby-Back Ribs; Jill Chatfield's Chili Relleno Bites; Mary & Doug Campbell's Gourmet Sliders with a side of Hawaiian Coleslaw and Mini Pecan Pies. Phillip Trujillo served Shawna's Special Chili. Commissioner Robert Aragon made his Grandmother's Bizcochitos with serving assistance from Katherine; and Tuda Libby Crews offered Mini Corned Beef Sandwiches and Chuck Wagon Bread Pudding (made from a secret recipe).

Master of Ceremony, Keith Kjelstrom, one of the New Mexico MainStreet Associates, explained MainStreet's successful 4-Point Approach for revitalizing rural economies. Harding County MainStreet Director Mary Campbell and board members Phillip Trujillo and Tuda Libby Crews relayed information regarding Harding County MainStreet activities on the local level.

Dr. Jeffrey Mitchell of the University of New Mexico's Bureau of Business Economic Research (BBER) presented findings of Harding County's Community Economic Assessment. Gillian Joyce, Research Scientist, reported on how the findings impact Harding County. The broad assessment includes research on Demographics, Households, Race/Ethnicity, Age, Education, Housing, Occupancy & Vacancy Status, Income, Income Support/Assistance, Economy, Employment, Agriculture Economy, Oil & Gas Production, Trade Area, Pull Factors, Challenges and Opportunities.

After the presentation the audience engaged in a QA session with thoughtful, in-depth discussion generated by the report. Both

professionals reiterated about confronting the challenges of living in a remote, rural, sparsely populated community. The audience was assured Harding County is not the only New Mexico community challenged by long driving distances, aging population, no work force, few jobs, no housing and low school enrollments. Both Mitchell and Joyce stressed "it's fine to demonstrate competitiveness between communities in school athletics; however, competitiveness doesn't work in economic development...it's imperative to join forces and work together".

While the Chef's samplings staged a friendly atmosphere for the evening program, the value of open discussion was even more satisfying. Perhaps a few people left with current, relevant information, a stronger sense of trust, and hope for the future. 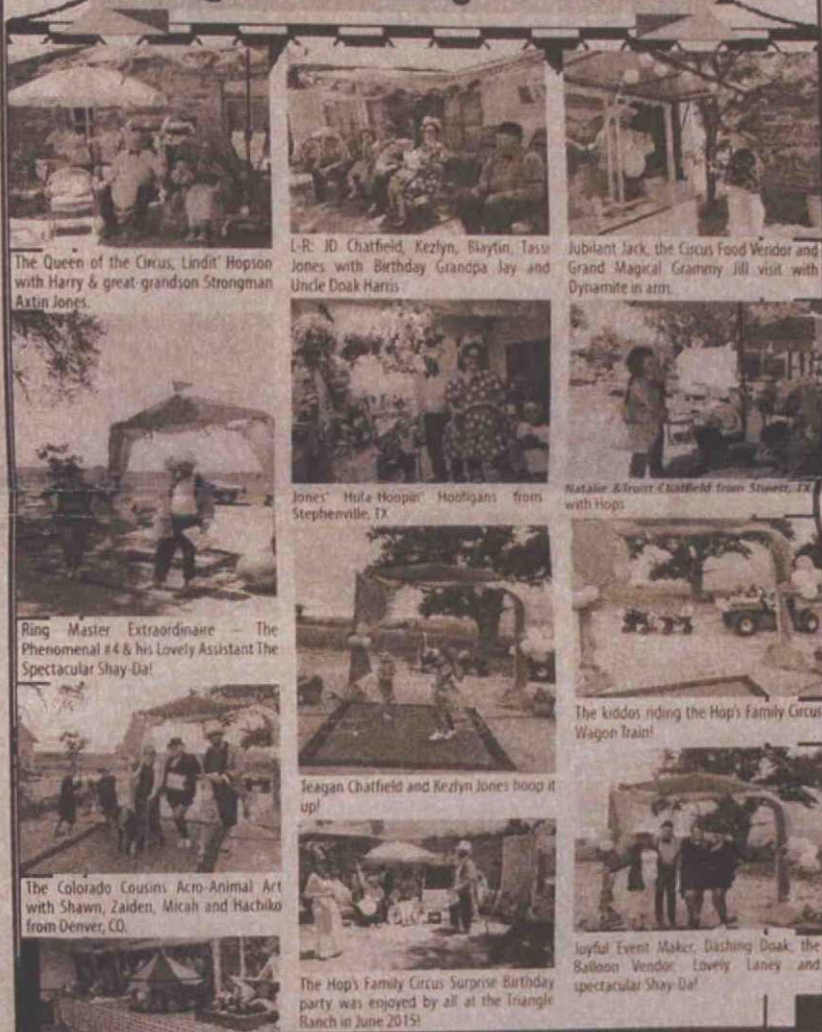
