I believe that is Case Number 15485, 4 5 application of COG Operating, LLC for a nonstandard oil 6 spacing and proration unit and compulsory pooling, Lea 7 County, New Mexico. 8 Call for appearances. MR. LARSON: Good morning, Mr. Examiner. 9 Gary Larson, Santa Fe office of Hinkle Shanor, for the 10 11 Applicant, COG Operating. EXAMINER GOETZE: And any other 12 13 appearances? 14 Very good. I believe there is a question about ownership and mineral estate? 15 16 MR. LARSON: That's correct, Mr. Examiner. I'll be presenting my case by affidavit. 17 Very good. 18 THE COURT: 19 As you noted, Mr. Examiner, an MR. LARSON: 20 issue arose at the previous hearing regarding a federal ownership interest in COG's proposed project area, 21 22 specifically the west half of the southwest quarter of Section 21, and the hearing was continued to give COG an 23 24 opportunity to look into the issue. 25 The result of COG's research is that while

1 the federal government does own the surface of the west 2 half-southwest quarter of Section 21, it does not own 3 the minerals.

I'll direct your attention to COG Exhibit
12, which is the affidavit of Mike Wallace, who
testified as COG's land expert at the previous hearing.
As stated in his affidavit, Mr. Wallace directed COG's
efforts to determine the owner interests in the west
half-southwest quarter of Section 21.

10 There are three documents attached to 11 Mr. Wallace's affidavit. The first is a patent signed 12 by the venerable President Warren G. Harding in 1923 13 that conveys all of the United States' interest in the 14 west half-southwest guarter of Section 21.

The second document is a 1973 corrected warranty deed that conveys the surface of the west half-southwest quarter of Section 21 back to the United States but reserves all of the mineral interests.

And the third and final document is a master plat -- a BLM master plat that identifies the federal government's interest in the west half-southwest quarter of Section 21 as surface only.

In conclusion, COG has fulfilled its obligation to research the ownership of the minerals in the west half-southwest quarter of Section 21 and has

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1	demonstrated that the federal government does not own
2	any mineral interests in that acreage.
3	And at that point, I'll move the admission
4	of COG Number 12.
5	EXAMINER GOETZE: It's a rarity that we
6	have the President of the United States entered as
7	evidence. So with that, Exhibit 12 is so entered.
8	(COG Operating, LLC Exhibit Number 12 is
9	offered and admitted into evidence.)
10	MR. LARSON: And I request the case be
11	taken under advisement and COG's application be
12	approved.
13	EXAMINER GOETZE: Very good. Then we will
14	take Case 15485 under advisement. Thank you.
15	MR. LARSON: Thank you, Mr. Examiner.
