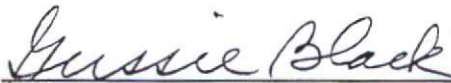

To the best of my knowledge, Russia's reported involvement in shaping public opinion came to light in 2010, when different WikiLeaks revelations made public private intelligence from Stratfor, which had previously published a background brief on Shale Gas Activism — that speculated on Russian funding for the anti-fracking movie Gasland.

The idea that Russia is funding anti-fracking groups, such as the Sierra Club and the Natural Resource Defense Council, has popped up in a variety of outlets including the 2013 movie FrackNation, and in 2014 comments from NATO secretary general, Anders Fogh Rasmussen, the former Prime Minister of Denmark. And then, in late 2014,

blatant. And then, in late 2014, the New York Times featured a story titled: "Russian money suspected behind fracking protests." In 2015, The Washington Free Beacon reported on a Bermudian firm that had connections to Russian oil interests and was funneling money to anti-fracking groups in the U.S.

But, now, thanks to WikiLeaks, Russia's reported anti-fracking funding is back in the headlines. "Leaked emails show Hillary Clinton blaming Russians for funding 'phony' anti-fracking groups,"

With knowledge only someone with a high-level security clearance and an understanding of foreign relations. Like the Secretary of State, would have, Hillary. In a June 2011 speech in Edmonton, Canada, reportedly said the following to an audience:

"We were up against Russia pushing oligarchs and others to buy media. We were even up against phony environmental groups, and I'm a big environmentalist, but those were funded by the Russians to stand against any effort, oh that pipeline, that fracking, whatever will be a problem for you, and a lot of the money supporting that message was coming from Russia."

Remember, we are in an economic war and there are many who don't want America to win. The cheap energy prices tracking has provided give the U.S. an economic advantage — hence the hostility toward it.

help you ease your debt burden.

Try the snowball approach. This is the approach where you pay down the balance on the highest-interest card first, then the next highest-interest card, and so forth. You should always make the largest payment you can on your highest-interest debt.

Pay on time. Late fees are like an Achilles heel for many cardholders. They not only hurt your bank account, they hurt your credit score. (Conversely, improving your credit score may make your debt cheaper to pay off, and make it easier to refinance or arrange a consumer loan.)

Disposal is providing notice that the Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has issued a tentative decision for an Application for Permit for a new Surface Waste Management Facility (C.K. Disposal). The Application for Permit was originally submitted in OCD by C.K. Disposal on 11/06/2015. Comments regarding the tentative decision may be submitted to OCD within 30 days following this notice.

- 2 Applicant's name and address: C.K. Disposal, LLC, 3909 86th Street, Lubbock, Texas 79424
- 3 Facility location and address: C.K. Disposal, LLC P Landfill and Processing Facility is located in Lots 1 through 6 and the north half of Section 5, Township 22 north, Range 38 east, N41P M, The County of New Mexico. The site is 0.65 miles south of State Highway 234, approximately 4-10 miles southeast of Elmer, New Mexico
- 4 Background information about the facility: The facility was constructed a total of 116.77 acres with a landfill footprint of 141.50 acres, a liquid processing unit of 31.75 acres, and a subsurface disposal unit of 5.0 acres. The landfill will have a total designed capacity of approximately 24,585,056-cu-yards. The C.K. Disposal surface waste management facility has been developed in accordance with NMAC 19.1.36
- 5 Depth and quality of shallowest aquifer: Based upon information provided from nearby wells, the shallowest potential water-bearing zone in the vicinity is the Chiswick Formation, which is approximately 225-feet (10) below ground surface (bgs) at the C.K. Disposal site. The C.K. Disposal site characterization boring investigation results demonstrate that no shallow groundwater is present above a depth of 175-feet bgs at any of the boring locations. Based on nearby wells, groundwater depth is approximately 225-feet below the site with a minimum TDS concentration of approximately 11,400-mg/L.

- 7 Disables-approved description of alternatives, exceptions or waivers: C.K. Disposal, LLC requests the following alternatives:
1) It is noted previously, a landfill gas (LFG) is typically produced when there is a significant supply of readily degradable organic materials. Therefore, as the site is the first facility to receive waste, there are no significant amounts of organic waste and will not produce a suitable environment for LFG production. Typical oil field wastes will not generate significant quantities of LFG, nor the requisite nutrients to promote biomass. A gas monitoring program consisting of installing monitoring chambers during technology will be utilized. Areas around the landfill disposal cells, bearing plant, liquid solidification, and expression ponds will utilize ammonia source compliance with the existing National Gas monitoring of the proposed waste mass monitoring wells will also be considered. Monitoring points may be added or replaced as needed.

Ground-water monitoring: During initial site investigation (Fig. 15) soil borers were taken on-site to a depth of 175-feet below ground surface. No groundwater was observed in the cuttings, nor in the bore holes after a 24-hour period of drilling. No groundwater was present within the upper 175-feet of the Ogish Formation or Chalk Formation. Therefore, a radon concentration system has been designed for the facility. The design considered the thickness, stratigraphy, lithology, and hydrologic characteristics of the geologic units as well as the depth to groundwater. Eleven (11) radon zone monitoring wells have been designed and identified along a point of compliance on the site perimeter. In addition, per USDO's request the facility must install three additional radon monitoring wells evenly spaced located north of the ponds in the southern portion of the facility.

Ground detection and drainage layers. A ground (flow) and geocomposite (sidelaps) will comprise the leak detection in the liner system at the C.K. Facility. The ground component will be used on the floor and the geocomposite will be placed on the side slopes. The ground geocomposite are designed to transfer fluid horizontally through the anticipated landfill lands.

Final Cover. The final cover system will be a combination two performance based liner systems. One design is for the top cap and the other for the side slopes. The top cap design will follow the design outlined in the NSMAC but will replace the drainage layer with a geocomposite drainage layer. The side slope final cover design will be a performance based a water balance cover. Both performance final covers have been modeled using the Hydrologic Evaluation of Landfill Performance (HELP) Model.

Bird Control: The C.K. Facility requests an exemption to not place screening material over ponds for migratory bird protection. The C.K. Facility will respect the evaporation ponds daily for birds and if a recurring problem the C.K. Facility will either submit a migratory bird plan or place screening over the ponds.

7. The OGD will accept comments and statements of interested registry staff's initiative decisions for a period of at least thirty (30) days after the date of publication of this notice, during which interested persons may submit comments or request that OGD hold a public hearing in accordance with 1015.4 of NMAC. Requests for a hearing will be in writing and set forth specific reasons why a hearing should be held. At the time of the hearing, the OGD will have up to 15 minutes to present its case. If the applicant requests a hearing, if the District Attorney determines there is significant public interest, or if the OGD determines that there are circumstances that indicate that there is a potential credible interest. Any such hearing will be conducted according to 1915.4.1.206 through 1915.4.1.215 NMAC. If no hearing is held, the Director will approve the proposed permit based on information available, including all comments received. If a public hearing is held, the Director will approve or disapprove the proposed permit based on information in the permit application and information submitted at the hearing.

Conforme a 19.15.36, Replazamiento para plantas de administración de Descargas superficiales de la División para Conservación de Petróleo (OCT), C.R. Diagonal provee aviso que la División para conservación de Petróleo (OCT) ha construido una decisión provisional aprobando la solicitud de permiso para la nueva planta de administración de Descargas superficiales (C.R. Diagonal). La solicitud de permisos fue originalmente presentada a OCT por C.R. Diagonal en 11.06.2015. Considerando que la solicitud pueden ser presentada a OCT hasta 10 días después de la publicación del presente aviso.

1. Nombre y dirección del solicitante: C.K. Duportal, 1142, 39018 85° Street, 1, Alameda, Tarea 76424
2. Dirección y ubicación de la planta: C.K. Duportal (E.A.P. Refugio Sanatorio) y Planta de Proceso está ubicada en sus terrenos 1 al 4 y la mitad sur de la mitad norte de la sección 5. Dentro Municipal 2da sur, rango 38 este, N.M.P.M. Comandó 1 con en Nuevo México. Duportal ha sido diseñada conforme a NMAC 19.13.36.
4. Profundidad y calidad del sustrato de profundidad mínima: basado en la información censal de prueva de agua circunvecinas, el acuífero tiene una profundidad aproximadamente 22-25-pies por debajo de la superficie de la planta C.K. Duportal, es el área de profundidad mínima al futuro más cercano. Adicionalmente, la investigación geotécnica concluyó acerca del diseño de la planta C.K. Duportal, que indica que las raíces profundas de 172 pies no fue dividida en ninguna de las zonas limitadas. 6. Descripción de Alternativas, excepciones o excepciones aprobadas por la División: IAC propone las siguientes:

Requisitos de control de GRS que de refuerzo sanitario (GRS) se prevén necesariamente cuando hay una fuente importante de material orgánico. Dichas medidas, la humedad, y la falta de oxígeno en el refuerzo sanitario. Resultados de yacimientos petrolíferos no contienen las significativas diferencias entre las muestras en su proporción de un elemento aleatorio para las muestras de GRS, tal que se requiera para obtener una interpretación. Resultados de yacimientos petrolíferos (GRS) no generan grandes cantidades de biogás, ni la presión necesaria para promover la migración. Se utilizó un programa de monitoreo de gas que consistió de sensores de reducidos volúmenes durante la descomposición. Así como se verificó en la órbita de almacenamiento del refuerzo sanitario, planes de tratamiento de fangos, la identificación y el análisis de exámenes utilizados monitores para promover el cumplimiento de los niveles regulatorios. También se midió el nivel de GRS en los puntos de monitoreo de la zona asegurada propiamente. Los puntos de control no pueden estar en el sistema de su respuesta.

Monitoreo del agua subterránea. Durante la investigación inicial del sitio se realizaron cinco (5) perforaciones a una profundidad de 175 pies debajo de la superficie del suelo. No se observó agua subterránea en los cortos, ni en las perforaciones de caliche durante un periodo de 21 horas. Agua subterránea sin color pero de alto grado de la formación (Oxidación o Formación Cloruro) Por lo tanto, un monitoreo de seguimiento de la zona insaturada ha sido desarrollado para el establecimiento T12 donde existen el asbesto, cianuro, etileno, etileno y otros contaminantes hidrofóbicos de las unidades geológicas, así como la profundidad del agua subterránea. Once (11) pozos de monitoreo de la zona saturada se han perforado y se han instalado en la zona de un pozo de almacenamiento en el perímetro del vertedero.
