Page 2 (9:00 a.m.) 1 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Good morning. This is 2 a meeting of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission. 3 4 My name is David Catanach. I'm chairman of the The time is 9:00 a.m. Today's date is July 5 Commission. 6 13th, 2017. This meeting is being conducted in Porter Hall within the Wendell Chino State Building. 7 At this time I will take roll, and I'll ask 8 the Commissioners to introduce themselves for the 9 10 record. COMMISSIONER MARTIN: Ed Martin 11 representing the State Land Office. 12 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Dr. Robert Balch, 13 designee of the Secretary of Energy, Minerals and 14 15 Natural Resources. CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Thank you, gentlemen. 16 Also present today is Mr. Bill Brancard, -17 who will be sitting in as Commission attorney. 18 19 And also present is Ms. Florene Davidson. 20 Commissioners, in your packet today, you should have an agenda for today's meeting. If you've 21 review the agenda, do I hear a motion and a second to 22 adopt the agenda? 23 24 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I've reviewed the 25 agenda, and I would move to adopt it.

Page 3 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: I agree with it and 1 second. 2 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: All in favor? 3 (Ayes are unanimous.) 4 5 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Motion to adopt today's agenda is passed. 6 7 Also in your packet are the draft minutes from the June 13th, 2017 Commission meeting. 8 Commissioners, I'd ask you if you've reviewed the 9 minutes, do you have any changes to the minutes, and, if 10 not, is there a motion and a second to adopt the 11 minutes? 12 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: I have reviewed them. 13 14 I have no changes, and I move to adopt. COMMISSIONER BALCH: And I second. 15 16 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: All in favor? 17 (Ayes are unanimous.) 18 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Motion to adopt the minutes from the June 13th Commission meeting is passed. 19 20 (The proceedings conclude, 9:02 a.m.) 21 (12:13 p.m.) 22 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Do we need to do a 23 litigation update? 24 Oh, yes. MR. BRANCARD: 25 So just briefly on litigation, we now have

Page 4 1 four appeals sitting in district court. CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Nice. 2 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Is that a new record? 3 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Are we doing something 4 right here or what? 5 MR. BRANCARD: Well, part of it is lack of 6 decision-making by the district court. 7 So we have the geothermal case, which I 8 filed a motion to dismiss for, and we had a hearing on 9 that last December. They have not ruled yet. 10 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Oh, wow. 11 MR. BRANCARD: So that's still sitting 12 there. 13 Then there is the Jalapeno-Matador case. 14 That has been fully briefed. As part of the briefing 15 filed by Matador, they filed motion to dismiss several 16 of the issues that Jalapeno had raised. The Court had 17 18 set a hearing in November on the case, but because Matador was the only one who asked for the hearing, the 19 hearing is only on the motion to dismiss. It's not on 20 the full case. But I will anticipate, going into the 21 22 hearing, the Court will want to hear the whole thing. 23 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Hmm. 24 MR. BRANCARD: The two more recent cases are the LES appeal of the 2K [sic] permit. So we've 25

Page 5 gotten the record in on that case this last week. 1 And so LES will have their brief due by early August, and 2 then we'll have to follow 30 days later with our brief 3 in that case. 4 Now, the fourth case -- it was just filed 5 yesterday -- was filed by COG in that case you had with 6 7 them. CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Nearburg. 8 MR. BRANCARD: Nearburg, right. 9 But their lawyers, in fact, were here today, and they informed me 10 that this is kind of just a placeholder appeal, that 11 they're trying to work it out, and they're going to try 12 to submit something with the Court staying the case. So 13 we don't have to file the record right away. 14 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: Better late than 15 16 never? 17 MR. BRANCARD: Yeah. CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Okay. I gotcha. 18 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I don't think they 19 have much of a negotiating place. 20 MR. BRANCARD: So that's where we are with 21 22 litigation. COMMISSIONER BALCH: As long as it's not 23 24 more Pit Rule stuff, I'm happy. 25 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Well, there were a

Page 6 couple of controversies in that case. There are some 1 rule changes coming up. I don't know exactly when. 2 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Those negotiations 3 will be for the next Commission. 4 5 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: That's true. MR. BRANCARD: And even in the district 6 7 court. They go on for years. COMMISSIONER BALCH: We've only got another 8 9 year and a half to go. We can certainly last that long. 10 MR. BRANCARD: I wouldn't be surprised with 11 the Jalapeno-Matador case, the hearing -- punt it up to 12 the Court of Appeals. He can do that on his own, given that's also the same judge. We haven't had the decision 13 14 in the geothermal case. I guess he's a little busy. And the judge who is doing the LES case is about to 15 16 retire. So --17 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Is that going to be taken over by -- who is the attorney who was going to 18 19 become appeals court judge? MR. BRANCARD: Yeah. He's appeals court. 20 21 All these cases are in the district court, because your 22 appeals for adjudicatory matters go to district court. 23 We did change the statute so that rulemaking appeals now go directly to the Court of 24 25 Appeals. Other matters go just to the district court,

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1	and they get a several-thousand-page record, and they
2	don't want to deal with it.
3	COMMISSIONER BALCH: I can't say I blame
4	them.
5	MR. BRANCARD: That's where we are.
6	CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Okay. Thanks for the
7	update. Thanks for all the work getting the records
8	together and stuff.
9	MR. BRANCARD: Yeah. Florene has her hands
10	full with all that stuff.
11	COMMISSIONER BALCH: Our meeting is moved
12	to October 5th or moved to October 4th instead?
13	CHAIRMAN CATANACH: That's on a Wednesday.
14	I don't know what's going on on the docket at this
15	point, obviously.
16	COMMISSIONER BALCH: Big docket. We have a
17	couple of days' drive back and forth to
18	CHAIRMAN CATANACH: We'll shoot for October
19	4th. I'll still have to I think I'm fine with that.
