WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 8:40 a.m.: 2 EXAMINER CATANACH: All right, at this time I'll 3 call Case 13,733, the Application of Energen Resources 4 Corporation for compulsory pooling, Rio Arriba County, New 5 Mexico. 6 7 Call for appearances. MR. HALL: Mr. Examiner, Scott Hall, Miller 8 Stratvert law firm, Santa Fe, appearing on behalf of the 9 Applicant Energen Resources Corporation, with one witness 10 11 this morning. 12 EXAMINER CATANACH: Call for any additional 13 appearances. There being none, will the witness please stand 14 15 to be sworn in? 16 (Thereupon, the witness was sworn.) 17 DAVID POGUE, the witness herein, after having been first duly sworn upon 18 19 his oath, was examined and testified as follows: 20 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. HALL: 21 22 Q. For the record, please state your name. 23 Α. My name is David Pogue. 24 Q. Mr. Pogue, where do you live and by whom are you 25 employed?

I live in Farmington, New Mexico. I'm employed 1 by Energen Resources Corporation. 2 And in what capacity for Energen? 3 I am a district landman for Energen. 4 Α. Okay. You've previously testified before the 5 Q. Division and had your credentials as an expert professional 6 landman established as a matter of record, have you not? 7 A. Yes, sir. 8 And you're familiar with the Application that's 9 0. been filed in this case and the lands that are the subject 10 of the Application? 11 Yes. A. 12 MR. HALL: Mr. Examiner, are the witness's 13 credentials acceptable? 14 They are. **EXAMINER CATANACH:** 15 (By Mr. Hall) Mr. Poque, explain what Energen 16 Q. 17 seeks by this Application. We would like to see the west half of Section 2 18 A. 19 pooled from the Mesaverde formation so that -- to -- so we 20 can complete our McCroden C Number 1 well. 21 Q. And is the McCroden C Number 1 a recompletion? Yes, it is. 22 Α. 23 Q. Okay. And what acreage are you seeking to pool? It's the west half of Section 2. 24 Α. 25 Q. Is that in 25 North, 3 West?

A. Yes, sir.

- Q. Let's look at your exhibits, if you would, please. Identify Exhibit 1.
- A. Exhibit 1 is a plat of the area to be communitized, showing the west half of the section. Shows the two federal leases covering lots 3 and 4 in the northwest quarter of Section 2, the north half, southwest quarter is also covered by an additional federal oil and gas lease. Energen Resources owns 100 percent of each of these leases. The south half, southwest quarter, Energen owns 78 percent of it, and the rest of it is unleased mineral interest owned by four different individuals.
- Q. Okay. And are the surface and bottomhole locations for the recompleted well standard?
 - A. Yes, they are.
- Q. Okay. Let's look at Exhibit 2, your AFE. If you would review the dryhole and completed well cost figures for the Examiner.
- A. The dryhole costs at present are nothing because the well is already drilled; it's just a recompletion attempt. The completed well cost would be \$189,980.
- Q. And are those recompletion costs in line with what you see in the Basin these days?
 - A. Yes, they are.
 - Q. All right. And have you made an estimate of the

overhead and administrative costs while drilling and 1 producing the well? 2 Yes, our requested drilling costs are \$5000 per 3 month, and the producing costs are \$570 per month. 4 And are the parties who are participating in this 5 Q. well agreed to these rates? 6 Yes, they have. 7 Α. Okay, and are these overhead rates also in line 8 Q. with what's being charged in the Basin? 9 10 Α. Yes. And are you recommending that these drilling and 11 producing rates be incorporated in any order that issues 12 from the Division? 13 Α. Yes, I am. 14 And are you asking that the Division provide for 15 an adjustment in those overhead rates in accordance with 16 the COPAS bulletin? 17 Α. Yes. 18 19 Let's look in a little more detail at your 20 ownership breakdown, your Exhibit 3. If you'd explain that to the Hearing Examiner. 21 22 Α. The Exhibit 3 shows the Mesaverde formation 23 ownership in this west half of Section 2 in our McCroden C 24 Number 1 well.

Energen has oil and gas leases and have joined in

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the well, and we own 95.08 percent.

JAS Oil and Gas, LLC, is an unleased mineral owner who has joined, owns 3.73 percent.

Josie Gallegos is unleased minerals. We presently find her unlocatable, and we have some indication she's deceased but we have not proof of that.

The Louis Martinez Estate, also unleased minerals, has joined in the well with their .28 percent.

And Amadito Valdez has unleased minerals. We have been able to be in contact with him, but we cannot get a response out of him or contact him by phone. He has .032 percent interest in the well.

- Q. Okay. And are you asking the Division to force pool these unjoined mineral interests at the statutory 1/8 royalty rate, 7/8 working interest rate?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. And are you also seeking the imposition of the 200-percent risk penalty against those interests?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Let's look at your Exhibit 4, and if you would just explain the efforts you undertook to try to locate these mineral interest owners and communicate with them.
- A. Exhibit 4 is copies of the letters sent. We sent letters to the Gallegos and Valdez people on March 3rd, followed up again on April the 7th. We have been able --

we have tried on numerous occasions to locate them by

phone, using Internet searches, as well as directory

assistance searches. Both letters to Josie Gallegos have

been returned by the post office.

And the certified return receipts from Amadito

Valdez have been returned, but we have been unable to

contact him or get a response out of him.

- Q. All right. And does a compilation of all of those letters comprise Exhibit 4?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. And the return receipts as well?
- A. Yes.

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- Q. Okay. In your opinion, has Energen made a good faith effort to attempt to locate those mineral interest owners and obtain their voluntary participation in the well?
 - A. Yes, we have.
- Q. In your opinion, would granting Energen's

 Application be in the interests of conservation, prevention

 of waste, protection of correlative rights?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. Were Exhibits 1 through 4 prepared by you?
- A. Yes, they were.
- MR. HALL: That concludes our direct of this witness, Mr. Examiner.

We'd move the admission of Exhibits 1 through 4, 1 and also Exhibit 5 as our notice affidavit, including the 2 affidavit of publication in the Rio Grande Sun for the 3 unlocatable mineral interest owners. 4 5 EXAMINER CATANACH: I'm sorry, Mr. Hall, did you say that did contain the publication notice? 6 MR. HALL: Yes. Is it not in your copy? It 7 should be under the cover page. 8 EXAMINER CATANACH: Oh, okay, sorry. 9 doesn't say what was in the -- This is just the affidavit 10 of publication. Do you have the actual publication? 11 MR. HALL: I have the original if you need that. 12 13 EXAMINER CATANACH: Oh, sorry, there it is. **EXAMINATION** 14 BY EXAMINER CATANACH: 15 Okay, Mr. Poque, where did you get the initial 16 Q. address that you used for Ms. Gallegos? 17 18 These parties are involved in another well that we have, and they're presently on pay through our Division 19 20 Order system, so we were able to use those addresses. 21 0. So this other well that she's involved in, you've 22 been trying to send her what, checks, or -- ? Josie Gallegos, all the checks are 23 Yeah.

That's why we think she's deceased, but we

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returned.

haven't been able to prove it.

And how long has that been going on? 1 Q. Oh, for over a year. 2 A. And why do you think that she may be deceased? 3 Q. Well, it's just the indication I get from our 4 Division Order staff. 5 And have you tried to contact Mr. Valdez by phone 6 Q. 7 or --Yes, we have. We can't find a phone number for 8 Α. 9 him. 10 Q. But he is receiving your letters? He's receiving the letters, he signs the return 11 receipts from the post office, but we can't get a response 12 out of him of any kind. 13 Q. Okay. Now, is this the first Mesaverde well that 14 will be on that west half? 15 Α. Yes. 16 17 And the well is currently -- it's drilled -- it's Q. a Dakota well, right? 18 19 It was drilled as a Gallup-Dakota, and that's been plugged. 20 21 So it's currently plugged and abandoned? Q. No, it's currently --22 Α. It's currently plugged --23 Q. -- shut in, right now. We had a rig in the area 24 Α. 25 last summer, just the last couple months, and we would have

1	had to move it out and then move it back in, so we went
2	ahead and did the recompletion work. And then once it was
3	done, it was shut in. And it's setting right now.
4	Q. So the well has already been recompleted?
5	A. Yes, the well has been recompleted in the
6	Mesaverde, but we haven't tested or produced it.
7	EXAMINER CATANACH: Okay, that's all I have.
8	MR. HALL: That concludes our case.
9	EXAMINER CATANACH: Did we admit the exhibits?
10	We may not have. Anyway, Exhibits 1 through 5 are admitted
11	in the case.
12	And there being nothing further, Case 13,733 will
13	be taken under advisement.
