FESMIRE, Chairman, on Thursday, September 13th, 2007, at the New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, 1220 South Saint Francis Drive, Room 102, Santa Fe, New Mexico, Steven T. Brenner, Certified Court Reporter No. 7 for the State of New Mexico.

WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2 9:04 a.m.: 3 4 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: At this time we will convene 5 the Thursday, September 13th, 2007, meeting of the New 6 Mexico Oil Conservation Commission. Let the record reflect 7 that Commissioner Bailey is present, Commissioner Fesmire 8 is present, but Commissioner Olson is not present. We do 9 10 still have a quorum, however, and we'll proceed with the meeting. 11 . 12 13 14 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The first item on the agenda 15 before the Commission is the adoption of the minutes. Commissioner Bailey, have you had a chance to 16 review the minutes as presented by the secretary? 17 18 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I have, and I move that we adopt them. 19 20 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: I too have reviewed the 21 minutes, and I second the motion for adoption. 22 All those in favor? 23 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 24 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Aye. 25 Let the record reflect that the minutes as

presented by the secretary have been adopted, will be signed by the Chairman and conveyed to the secretary.

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CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The first case before the

Commission is Case Number 13,531. It was the Application
of Yates Petroleum Corporation for an order directing Pride
Energy to reimburse Yates for well costs incurred by Yates
in the attempt to re-enter the State "X" Well Number 1, API
Number 30-025-01838, located in Section 12, Township 12
South, Range 34 East, NMPM, prior to the time that Pride
Energy assumed operations of the well; and number two,
directing Pride Energy Company to account for and pay all
sums it is now improperly holding pursuant to an expired
order of the Division and Commission; and three, requiring
Pride Energy Company to plug and abandon the State "X" Well
Number 1, Lea County, New Mexico.

The Commission deliberated and reached a decision in this case and directed the counsel, Cheryl Bada, to draft an order to effect the Commission's decision.

Counsel Bada, did you get a chance to do that for the Commission?

MS. BADA: Yes, the order has been drafted and it reflects the Commission's decision to allow the costs that Yates had submitted and that each party pay their

respective share of those costs. 1 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Commissioner Bailey, did you 2 3 get a chance to review the order? 4 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I have, and I move 5 that we sign it. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: I too have reviewed the order 6 7 and I will second her motion. All those in favor? 8 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 9 10 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Aye. Let the record reflect that the order as drafted represents the decision of the 11 Commission and will be signed by the two present members of 12 13 the Commission and conveyed to the secretary. 14 15 16 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The next case on the docket is 17 Case Number 13,492. It's the Application of Samson 18 Resources Company, Kaiser-Francis Oil Company and Mewbourne 19 Oil Company for cancellation of two drilling permits and 20 approval of a drilling permit in Lea County, New Mexico. 21 It has been functionally consolidated with Case 22 Number 13,493, the Application of Chesapeake Permian, L.P., 23 for compulsory pooling in Lea County, New Mexico. At present there are attorneys in the Commission 24 25 chambers who represent parties in the case. We will take

an entry of appearance from those attorneys.

MR. KELLAHIN: Mr. Chairman, I'm Tom Kellahin of the Santa Fe law firm of Kellahin and Kellahin, appearing this morning on behalf of Chesapeake.

MR. HALL: Mr. Chairman, Scott Hall of the Miller Stratvert law firm in Santa Fe. I'm representing Kaiser-Francis Oil Company.

CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: And Mr. Kellahin, did you have an announcement to make to the Commission this morning?

MR. KELLAHIN: Yes, Mr. Chairman. Mr. Hall and I are here to represent to the Commission that the parties involved have reported to us that they've signed all the appropriate settlement documents to reach a voluntary solution on this issue. And we have prepared and were hopeful that we could submit to the Division a suggested order, along with a motion for consideration.

Late yesterday there was some language discussion about two points in the proposed order, and Mr. Hall and I have not yet been able to get Mr. Gallegos -- to contact him to get his concurrence on how to handle that.

Our dilemma in the complexity of this is, we were taking the basics of the decision the Commission made, which was to form a 640-acre spacing unit for wells associated with this KF State 4 problem, to assign operations to Samson and to resolve all disputes about well

costs and all the rest.

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So in integrating the settlement to the order, there are portions of the settlement that totally replace the order. But we need to take those portions of the order that created the nonstandard 640-acre spacing unit as the predicate to then have a voluntary agreement for that solution.

And so we're almost there, short of finding Mr.

Gallegos and agreeing on the last few lines of the proposed order to submit to you.

What we're trying to do is give you an order that all the lawyers agree does what we think it does and so there's no dispute as to language or what we think the words say. If approved by you, then it will be fully consistent with the provisions of the settlement and acknowledge the consent of the parties to go forward with the basics of the order.

CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. And Mr. Gallegos agrees, at least in principle, with the agreement that you've proposed, and he's working on it also?

MR. KELLAHIN: And we've been doing this for months, and the original draft was prepared by me and submitted to Mr. Gallegos recently. He gave me some small changes. We all thought we were in agreement to those changes, but at the last minute there's some question about

whether the changes were exactly what ought to be done. 1 2 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. MR. KELLAHIN: And it was that last glitch 3 yesterday for which we can't find Mr. Gallegos and his 4 counterpart at Samson, Mark Lauer. He's in Houston, and 5 there's problems in Houston with weather and I guess he ran 6 7 away. 8 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Mr. Hall, is that your 9 understanding also? MR. HALL: Mr. Chairman, I agree with what Mr. 10 Kellahin has told you. I think the parties are very close 11 on a stipulated form of the order. The problem has been 12 one of communications rather than with the substance of 13 what the order provides you. 14 15 It's our expectation that we'll be able to 16 provide you with a stipulated order in the next few days, 17 in fact. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. Mr. Hall, Mr. Kellahin, 18 19 would you all have any objection to us continuing this to 20 the next regularly scheduled Commission meeting? 21 MR. KELLAHIN: Mr. Chairman, Mr. Hall and I have 22 discussed that, and we believe that's probably the appropriate thing to do. 23 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Commissioner Bailey, would you 24 have any objection? 25

1 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I have no objection. 2 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: With that, the Commission will 3 continue Cases Number 13,492 and 13,493 to the next regularly scheduled Commission meeting, which is October --4 5 MS. DAVIDSON: -- 11th. 6 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: -- 11th, at nine o'clock here 7 in Porter Hall. 8 10 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The next cause before the 11 Commission is Case Number 13,858, the Application of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for a compliance order 12 13 against Pronghorn Management Corporation, and Case Number 14 13,859, the Application of the New Mexico Oil Conservation 15 Division for a compliance order against Pronghorn Management Corporation. 16 17 It's my understanding that these cases have been 18 settled and are to be dismissed; is that correct? 19 MS. DAVIDSON: Right. 20 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. So -- and there is an order to that effect for each one of the cases, that has 21 22 been presented by the Commission secretary. And the orders 23 dismiss both cases; is that correct? 24 MS. DAVIDSON: Correct. 25 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Commissioner Bailey, have you

had a chance to review these orders?

COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I have, and I move that we sign them.

CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay, I second that motion.

All those in favor?

COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.

CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Aye.

Let the record reflect that the motion to dismiss Case Number 13,858 and Case Number 13,859 has passed, that an order to that effect has been drafted by the secretary and presented to the Commission and will be signed by the two members of the Commission present and conveyed to the secretary.

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CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The next case on the docket is Case Number 13,893. It's the Application of Yates

Petroleum Corporation for approval of a pilot project in the North Dagger Draw-Upper Pennsylvanian Unit for the purposes of establishing proper waterflood injection patterns and for a temporary exemption from the provisions of Division Rule 203 concerning approved temporary abandonment of wells.

Attorneys for the Applicant have requested a continuance in this case, again until the October 11th,

2007, meeting. 1 Commissioner Bailey, do you see any reason not to 2 grant that continuance? 3 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: No, I don't. 4 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay, at this time that 5 continuance will be granted and case Number 13,893 will be 6 7 continued to the October 11th, 2007, regularly scheduled Commission meeting. 8 10 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The next case before the 11 Commission is Case Number 13,920. It's the Application of 12 the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for a compliance 13 order against Northstar Oil and Gas. 14 15 It's my understanding that this case is also on 16 the verge of being settled and that the parties have 17 requested a continuance in this case to allow that settlement; is that correct? 18 19 MS. DAVIDSON: (Nods) 20 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. Case Number 13,920 --21 Commissioner Bailey, I'm sorry, do you see any 22 reason not to grant this continuance? 23 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: No, I don't. 24 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Case Number 13,920 will be also continued to the October 11th, 2007, Commission 25

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4	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: That concludes the business on
5	the docket before the Commission. Is there anything else
6	that the Commission to address?
7	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Not from me.
8	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. At this time the Chair
9	would entertain a motion for adjournment.
10	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I move we adjourn.
11	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: I second that motion.
12	All those in favor?
13	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.
14	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Aye.
15	Let the record reflect that the Commission
16	meeting was adjourned at 9:15 a.m.
