EXAMINER EZEANYIM: Good Morning, everybody. We're going on the record now. I think before we proceed, I need to make a couple of announcements. As you can see, we have a different court reporter, Joyce Calvert, by name. So, we lost Steve. So we're very happy to have Joyce today.

And, again, for the attorneys present today and for those who are not present, there is something we wanted to be given to us on the pre-hearing statements. When you submit your pre-hearing statements, if you have witnesses in them, please write their name, their title, their phone number, and their address below so that we can then ask for more information.

For example, sometimes we review these applications and we want to contact the engineer, and there is no way to find the name or any information on their portion. So please, when you submit your pre-hearing statements next time, give us that information so that we can call them directly.

I know you attorneys are very busy and I know when we call we don't get anybody. And what happens is that we put it aside until we get some information. But if that information is in the pre-hearing statement, we could call the engineer or the landman or the geologist and get the information without going through the attorney.

24 MR. BROOKS: Well, Mr. Ezeanyim, you're an engineer. 25 You may be free to do that. As an attorney, I'm not allowed to

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do that because it's prohibited by the code of conduct that applies to attorneys. So I will not be contacting witnesses or people that are represented by attorneys except through their attorneys. You may continue.

5 EXAMINER EZEANYIM: Well, yeah. I don't know that. 6 I'm not an attorney. But my quest is to get information. We 7 do whatever is necessary for us to get at the information, 8 otherwise your order will be delayed. My job is to make sure 9 that we get the order on time to you.

10 On that, too, it's over eight months now we haven't 11 filled the second position for an engineer here. So we are 12 still looking. But we have been working very hard to make sure 13 we get your orders out and increase the activity on the orders 14 that come in to us. I know we are all pressed for time. So 15 anything we can do to make sure we get your order and conclude 16 your business is what we're asking for anyway.

17 So, anyway, do whatever you think is necessary so we 18 can get that information. Thank you.

19 MR. BROOKS: Thank you.

MUNDS-DRY: Thank you. 11 EXAMINER EZEANYIM: Any other continuances? 12 MR. SWAZO: Mr. Hearing Examiner, I'd like to direct your attention to Case No. 3 on Page 2, Case 14075. I'm going 13 14 to move to dismiss that case. The operator did come into 15 compliance with Rule 201, and the well does report activity. EXAMINER EZEANYIM: Okay. So you want to dismiss the 16 17 case? 18 MR. SWAZO: Yes, 14075. EXAMINER EZEANYIM: The record will reflect that 19 Case No. 14075 is dismissed. 20 21 MR. SWAZO: With regard to Case No. 8, on Page 5, 22 14054. 23 EXAMINER EZEANYIM: Okay. 24 MR. SWAZO: That case was actually continued to 25 February 21st.
