

NOTICE

To: The heirs or devisees of Frank M. Johnson, Jr.: Parallel Petroleum Corporation has filed an application for compulsory pooling with the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, seeking an order pooling all mineral interests from the surface to the base of the Wolfcamp formation underlying Lots 1-4 and the S/2N/2 (the N/2) of Section 5, Township 15 South, Range 25 East, NMPM, Chaves County, New Mexico, to form a standard 321-acre gas spacing and proration unit for all formations developed on 320 acre spacing within that vertical extent. The unit is to be dedicated to the proposed Charismatic 1525-5 Well No. 1, to be drilled from a surface location 760 feet from the north line and 208 feet from the east line of Section 5, with a penetration point 760 feet from the north line and 660 feet from the east line, and a terminus 760 feet from the north line and 660 feet from the west line, of Section 5. Also to be considered will be the cost of drilling and completing the well and the allocation of the cost thereof, as well as actual operating costs and charges for supervision, designation of applicant as operator of the well, and a 200% charge for the risk involved in drilling and completing the well. The application is scheduled to be heard at 8:15 a.m. on Thursday, August 7, 2008 at the Division's offices at 1220 South St. Francis Drive, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87505. As an interest owner in the well unit you have the right to enter an appearance and participate in the case. Failure to appear will preclude you from contesting this matter at a later date. The attorney for applicant is James Bruce, P.O. Box 1056, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87504. The unit is located approximately 7 miles northwest of Lake Arthur, New Mexico.


