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3 1 MR. STAMETS: Call next Case Number 2 7890. 3 MR. PEARCE: That case is on the appli-Δ cation of Marshall R. Young Oil Company for a unit agreement, 5 Luna County, New Mexico. 6 7 MR. KELLAHIN: If the Examiner please, I'm Tom Kellahin of Santa Fe, New Mexico, appearing on behalf 8 of the applicant and I have two witnesses to be sworn. 9 10 (Witnesses sworn.) 11 12 BONNIE LIMPUS, 13 being called as a witness and being duly sworn upon her oath, 14 testified as follows, to-wit: 15 16 17 DIRECT EXAMINATION 18 BY MR. Young 14 Oil Company and its partners committed to the unit, in your 15 opinion will the operator have effective and efficient con-16 trol over the unit operations? 17 Yes. A. 18 MR. The proposed first unit well is to be 8 located where? 9 A. In Section 11, Township 26 South, Range 11 10 West. 11 Q. And that's identified by the arrow on the 12 map? 13 That's correct. A. 14 Q. What is to be the depth of the well at that 15 location? 16 10,000 feet. A. 17 And your primary objective, then, will be . Q. 18 to test the Fusselman structure that you've depicted on the 19 exhibit. 20 That's right. A. 21 Okay. Where is the closest Fusselman pro-Q. 22 duction to this project? 23 It would be in west Texas in the Midland A. 24 area; probably 2 - 250 miles to the east. 25 Are you aware of any Fusselman production in Q.

1 11 2 Luna County at this time? 3 No, there is none. Α. 4 In your opinion, Mr. Brace, does the pro-0. 5 posed unit area conform to and generally overlie the antici-6 pated Fusselman formation? 7 Yes, it does. A. 8 **Q.** Were Exhibits Four and Five prepared by you 9 or compiled under your direction and supervision? 10 They were prepared by me. A. 11 In your opinion, Mr. Brace, will approval **Q.** 12 of this application be in the best interests of conservation, 13 the prevention of waste, and the protection of correlative 14 rights? 15 A. Yes. 16 MR. KELLAHIN: That concludes my exam-17 ination of Mr. Brace. 18 We move the introduction of Applicant's 19 Exhibits One through Five. 20 MR. STAMETS: The exhibits will be ad-21 mitted. 22 Are there any questions of the witness? 23 He may be excused. 24 Anything further in this case? 25 MR. GORTHEY: I would like to just ente
