APPLICATION

LYNX PETROLEUM CONSULTANTS, INC., ("Lynx") through its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application to the Oil Conservation Division pursuant to the provisions of NMSA 1978, § 70-2-17, for an order pooling all mineral interests in the following described spacing unit located in the W/2 of Section 28, Township 20 South, Range 30 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico to form a 320–acre spacing unit in the Strawn formation. In support of its application, Lynx states:

- 1. Lynx is a working interest owner in the W/2 of said Section 28 and has the right to drill thereon.
- 2. Lynx proposes to dedicate the above-referenced spacing or proration units to its Emperor Oil Fed Gas B Com Well No.1. This well is located in Section 28, Township 20 South, Range 30 East, N.M.P.M., to be re-completed in the Strawn formation, Golden Lane Strawn Gas Pool, from a location 1980 feet from the North and West lines of said Section 28, Eddy County, New Mexico.
- 3. Lynx has sought and been unable to obtain a voluntary agreement for the development of these lands from certain interest owners in the subject spacing units. These owners are identified on **Exhibit A** to this application.
- 4. Said pooling of interests will avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, will prevent waste and will protect correlative rights.

5. In order to permit Lynx to obtain its just and fair share of the oil and gas underlying the

subject lands, all mineral interests should be pooled, and Lynx should be designated the operator of the

well to be drilled.

WHEREFORE, Lynx Petroleum Consultants, Inc. requests that this application be set for

hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on January 8, 2009 and, after notice and

hearing as required by law, the Division enter its order:

A. pooling all mineral interests in the subject spacing and proration units;

B. designating Lynx Petroleum Consultants, Inc. operator of these units and the well to be

drilled thereon;

C. authorizing Lynx Petroleum Consultants, Inc. to recover its costs of drilling, equipping

and completing the well;

D. approving the actual operating charges and costs of supervision while drilling and after

completion, together with a provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS

accounting procedures; and

E. imposing a penalty for the risk assumed by Lynx Petroleum Consultants, Inc. in drilling

and completing the well against any working interest owner who does not voluntarily

participate in the drilling of the well;
