3	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: The next item on the agenda
4	is Case 13,013 the Application of the New Mexico Oil
5	Conservation Division for amendment of Rule 711, applicable
6	to surface waste management facilities only.
7	And I'll call for appearances at this point.
8	MR. BROOKS: Madame Chairman, honorable
9	Commissioners, I'm David Brooks, Energy, Minerals and
10	Natural Resources Department of the State of New Mexico,
11	appearing for the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division.
12	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you, Mr. Brooks.
13	MR. BROOKS: I have no witnesses.
14	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Anybody else here to speak
15	on this particular matter?
16	MR. GALLAGHER: Madame Chairman, Bob Gallagher,
17	President of the New Mexico Oil and Gas Association.
18	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you, Mr. Gallagher.
19	What we plan to do today is lay this Application out for
20	the Commission and then schedule a hearing on the proposed
21	amendments.
22	So Mr. Brooks, would you
23	MR. BROOKS: Yes, ma'am.
24	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: describe this
25	MR. BROOKS: Madame Chairman and honorable

Commissioners, this is a very simple Application. I take this opportunity to remind the Commissioners that at a public hearing on the hydrogen sulfide rule last October, I believe, the Commissioners did charge the Division with the responsibility of developing revisions to update the surface waste management rules, Rule 711.

This is not the revision that was contemplated by that charge and was promised by sometime next summer. This instead is what you might call a one-shot amendment. It's intended to deal with a particular situation.

The amendment amends Section -- and I admit I don't have the -- somehow I did not get the page that has the subsection number. It's (4)(c) -- subparagraph (4)(c), and it is subsection C, so it is subparagraph C.(4)(c) of Rule 711, or Section 711.

And the present Rule provides that a surface waste management facility licensed by OCD pursuant to Rule 711 cannot accept non-oilfield wastes except in emergency when required by the Department of Public Safety.

The proposed amendment would allow such a facility, with prior approval from the Division, to accept nonhazardous non-oilfield wastes for disposal at those facilities.

So that is just what it is in a nutshell, and I would remind the Commission that because it was not noticed

in the New Mexico Register for a hearing on this date, that it would not be possible for the Commission to hold a public hearing at this time. But the matter is submitted to the Commission for their consideration.

Thank you.

CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you, Mr. Brooks.

What I was going to propose that we do is request that all written comments be filed on this particular proposal by March 13th, which is a week before our next meeting, and then at our next meeting on March 20th we would plan to take testimony and any public comments on the proposal.

And Mr. Brooks and Mr. Ross, if you would make sure that we publicize however we need to the request that written comments be submitted by March 13th, we would appreciate it.

I think at this point if anybody in the audience wishes to make a comment or statement on the Rule, we could accept those statements at this point.

Mr. Gallagher?

MR. GALLAGHER: Madame Chairman, Commissioners, Bob Gallagher, President of the New Mexico Oil and Gas Association. We represent 300 oil and gas companies that do business in New Mexico. I'm here today in support of this amendment.

With our companies, obviously, they just don't operate in New Mexico; they operate in a lot of other states. And we're starting to hear a lot of conversation about not having this non-oilfield wastes, and where are they disposed, and what is the final disposition of those?

And we believe that this is a proper amendment to the Rule in that it still gives final approval to the Division. It does require similar characteristics of oilfield waste and it does require, obviously, the production of that waste being generated by some sort of gas activity, or like activity.

You know, when the Rules and Regulations were written many years ago, you don't anticipate what may or may not come up. We're dealing with a piece of legislation now that is going to set rules and regulations for helium. All I know about helium is it's what you put in a balloon and it makes you talk funny. But be that as it may, someone wants to produce and sell helium in New Mexico, and this obviously would be of assistance to that because it absolutely clarifies non-oilfield waste, and what is oilfield waste, and then allows for non-oilfield waste to be disposed of properly in these facilities.

And we believe that this will assist our companies. Our companies have a lot of in-house regulations, they have a lot of other-state regulations,

and I believe this will assist our companies in being able to properly dispose of nonhazardous non-oilfield waste by definition in these existing facilities, and I would urge the Commission to favorably look upon this amendment, hopefully take testimony and in fact hopefully vote at the next meeting to allow this clarification. Thank you, Madame Chair. CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you, Mr. Gallagher. Anybody else wish to make a comment today? Okay, then, we will take this particular Application up again on March 20th. Thank you, Mr. Brooks, Mr. Gallagher. (Thereupon, these proceedings were concluded at 9:18 a.m.)
